ACIP RECOMMENDATIONS AND CDSI

ACIP voted on the 2016-2017 influenza recommendations during the June meeting. The official recommendations were released in the August 26, 2016 MMWR found at www.cdc.gov/mmwr/volumes/65/rr/pdfs/rr6505.pdf. The two most notable changes from previous years are the modification to egg allergy language and the recommendation to not use LAIV due to effectiveness concerns.

The Clinical Decision Support for Immunization (CDSi) project recently published version 3.0 of their Logic Specification and Supporting Data. Version 3.0 is an expanded scope from earlier versions to include patient related observations which either indicate vaccination, contraindicate vaccination or provide evidence of immunity. The CDSi project is now working on updated test cases to reflect the version 3.0 scope and to incorporate the 2016-2017 influenza recommendations.

IMPROVING DATA QUALITY FOR IMMUNIZATION (IDQI) PROJECT ADVISORY GROUP



The Pan American Health Organization (PAHO) is creating a guidance document for countries wanting to implement or improve an electronic immunization registry. The advisory group met August 22-23 in Washington, D.C. to revise and finalize the draft document on the planning, design, development and implementation of a national electronic immunization registry. Rebecca Coyle attended the meeting on behalf of AIRA. Meeting participants were placed into smaller groups based on experience and expertise and focused their efforts on

reviewing select chapters. Participants were tasked with evaluating whether the document was clear, easy to understand and responded to the proposed objective(s). Participants also verified that the contributions from previous meetings were included and identified any additional concepts for inclusion. The staff at PAHO will now incorporate revisions from the advisory meeting into the final document.

NATIONAL HPV VACCINATION ROUNDTABLE MEETING

The American Cancer Society hosted the second National HPV Vaccination Roundtable Meeting in Atlanta, Georgia August 30-31. The National HPV Vaccination Roundtable, established by the American Cancer Society (ACS) and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) in 2014, is a national coalition of public organizations, private organizations, voluntary organizations, and invited individuals dedicated to reducing the incidence of and mortality from HPV-associated cancer in the U.S., through coordinated leadership and strategic planning. Rebecca Coyle attended the meeting on behalf of AIRA.

This meeting provided an opportunity for the various task groups that were established last year to highlight the work products the groups have created over the past 12 months. Many of the products will be available for anyone in public health with the goal of reducing HPV-associated cancers. One of the key messages that ACS and others are wanting to change is that HPV should be administered "on time" to all males and females aged 11-12. The EHR/IIS Task Group worked with a consultant to conduct a review of providers to gauge their perceptions on the challenges of using their electronic health record system or IIS to increase HPV vaccination. 2016 PUBLIC HEALTH INFORMATICS CONFERENCE



The 2016 Public Health Informatics
Conference was held in Atlanta,
Georgia August 21-24. The conference
was hosted by the National Association
of City and County Health Officials
(NACCHO) and the CDC, and was
well-attended by hundreds of public
health and informatics professionals
from across the country. Of particular
note were presentations by Dr. Dave
Ross of the Public Health Informatics
Institute (PHII) and Dr. Karen DeSalvo of
the US Department of Health and

Human Services. Dr. DeSalvo specifically called out the success of IIS during her closing plenary talk, citing uptake in IIS use across the country as a great measure of public health success. Dr. Ross spoke to the importance of aligning as "One Public Health," emphasizing his point with the memorable statement that although all state and local jurisdictions are *special*, our work is not necessarily *different* across public health programs, and it is in our best interest to collaborate nationally to ensure a united voice in creating healthy populations.

AIRA also presented a workshop on IIS Assessment and Testing in collaboration with the National Institutes of Standards in Technology (NIST) and the State of Oregon's ALERT IIS, and presented on a panel with other public health programs on Meaningful Use Stage 3 readiness.

NOW OFFERING AIRA TRAINING & EDUCATION PACKAGE

To better serve the needs of our members, AIRA is now offering an AIRA Training & Education Package to help our members attend the AIRA 2017 National Meeting. SMARTY SHEETS CHOSEN AS ADDRESS CLEANSING SERVICE

AIRA and the Joint Development and Implementation (JDI) Advisory Workgroup are pleased to announce the preliminary selection of a vendor to support address cleansing and geocoding efforts across the IIS community. Three services were researched and evaluated in



depth over several months, and one service emerged as a clear front-runner. The selected vendor is Smarty Streets, a widely utilized and lauded service that provides a user friendly interface and API (application program interface), comprehensive documentation, and an affordable enterprise approach to address validation and standardization as well as geocoding information. The selection followed a strong unanimous recommendation from the JDI Advisory Workgroup, and full unanimous

approval by the AIRA Board in August. You can learn more about Smarty Streets by reviewing their <u>website</u>, and more about the research process regarding address cleansing <u>here</u>.

AIRA is currently working on developing a contract and license with Smarty Streets, and will be launching a pilot project within the coming weeks. An implementation guidance document will be developed in parallel with the project pilot. The initial pilot phase will involve batch validation of data at rest, as well as validation of user-interface-entered data. The service is capable of cleansing incoming HL7 and electronic data as well, and may also be evaluated as a component of the pilot. Availability of an enterprise-wide service is anticipated in 2017. AUGUST RECAP

Assessment Steering Committee

The Assessment Steering Committee (ASC) met on August 2nd and received a progress update on the Addendum to the <u>Analytic Guide for Assessing Vaccination Coverage Using an IIS</u> and The *Data Validation Guide – For the IIS Onboarding Process*. Both documents were sent out for community review and after the feedback is incorporated, will be prepared for publication. Laura Pabst (CDC) also presented and asked for feedback on CDC metrics development for the new Functional Standards.

Standards and Interoperability Steering Committee

- The Standards and Interoperability Steering Committee (SISC) met on August 10th and reviewed the proposal to ballot the Implementation Guide through HL7. The timeline was extended and the HL7 review process will begin in May 2017 rather than January 2017. A formal vote was taken and the committee approved a recommendation to the AIRA Board to move forward with balloting the Implementation Guide.
- The SISC Technical Workgroup met on August 31st and discussed ideas for improving ACK messages. Kevin Snow presented different scenarios and sections that could be clarified and enhanced. This discussion will be continued on the September SISC Technical Workgroup call. The workgroup will come up with a proposal to take back to the full SISC in October.

Education Steering Committee

• The Education Steering Committee (ESC) met on August 17th. The committee published the August 2016 edition of <u>SnapShots</u> available on <u>AIRA's website</u>. The committee also received an update on the AIRA 2017 National Meeting to be held in Chicago, Illinois and reviewed the evaluation results from the AIRA 2016 Hawaii Regional Meeting.

MIROW Steering Committee

 The MIROW Steering Committee cancelled its August meeting due to the MIROW inperson Subject Matter Expert meeting in Decatur, Georgia. The next MIROW meeting will be held on September 15th, 2016 (4-5 pm EST).
