CHANGE MANAGEMENT TRAINING

AIRA's partner organization Public Health Informatics Institute (PHII) has begun a project to focus on developing capacity for change management. As part of this initiative AIRA staff attended a 3 day change management training in Colorado Springs, Colorado. In the Prosci model of change management, there are three elements critical to project success: leadership/sponsorship, project management, and change management. Most are familiar with the first two elements. The third, change management, is defined as the process, tools and techniques to manage the people side of change to achieve required results. Look for more information about change management capacity development in coming months, as we look to strengthen the capacity of the IIS community to navigate the never ending need to evolve.

CAIR 2.0 TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE VISIT

On January 28-29, 2016, at the request of California's new Immunization Program Manager, three AIRA staff traveled to Richmond, California to meet with staff on the California team. The goal of the visit was to learn about the state's transition plans as they prepare to roll out CAIR 2.0 at the end of this calendar year, and to provide consultation on their planning and implementation process.

The California team brought together a broad set of skilled and experienced staff members to share how their roles and responsibilities would assure a smooth transition, from top leadership to technical expertise, to front-line trainers and testers. California's IIS Vendor was also represented to share about the intersection of program and vendor activities. Nathan Bunker, AIRA's Senior Technical Manager, and Mary Beth Kurilo, AIRA's Policy and Planning Director, spent two full days with the CAIR 2.0 team discussing their approach. Rebecca Coyle, AIRA's Executive Director, met with the team on day 2 to talk about leveraging external stakeholders and peer support. California will be consolidating seven regional IIS that comprise CAIR 1.0 into one instance of CAIR 2.0, a WIR-based product that will become a full statewide IIS. Three regional or county systems will feed into and exchange data with CAIR 2.0 as well. The California team was generous in sharing their documentation and information, and the AIRA team is excited to provide recommendations, tools, and lessons learned from the broader AIRA member base to support their transition.

JANUARY RECAP

Assessment Steering Committee

- The Assessment Steering Committee (ASC) met on January 5th. The committee reviewed the proposed scope for the Quality Assurance Implementation Guidelines project. It has been determined that the project will be broken up into 2 phases over the next 2 years. A SME workgroup will convene every 2 weeks for the next several months while reviewing the resources collected and will then convene monthly to review drafts of the guide.
- The ASC will be hosting a webinar to introduce the Analytic Guide for Coverage Assessment Using an IIS on Monday, March 14th at 3:00 pm ET. Details for this webinar can be found on the [AIRA website](#).

Standards and Interoperability Steering Committee

- The Standards and Interoperability Steering Committee (SISC) met on January 13th. The SISC continued the discussion on the timeline for the next release of the Implementation Guide. AIRA and CDC will meet to create a proposal that incorporates the ideas suggested during the meeting. The SISC will also be working on the vocabulary for the next release to bring clarity to some of the value sets.
- The SISC Technical Workgroup met on January 27th and began a discussion about the use of "other" when sending a refusal reason with NIP002. This topic will be revisited during the February SISC meeting. The Technical Workgroup meeting has been rescheduled for February 17th at 1:00 pm ET due to a scheduling conflict.

Education Steering Committee

- The Education Steering Committee (ESC) met on January 20th. A regional meeting will be held in Hawaii in July 2016. The ESC is also looking into hosting a southeast regional meeting in Atlanta, GA in the fall of 2016.
- The ESC will be hosting a webinar on February 29th that will provide an introduction to VTrks ExIS Usability Best Practice Catalog. Details for this webinar can be found on the [AIRA website](#).

MIROW Steering Committee

- The MIROW Steering Committee (SC) met on January 21st to continue to develop the scope for the next topic and discuss the status of the current topic "Decrementing Inventory via Electronic Data Exchange (DI-v-EDE)." A draft was released at the end of January for internal review and will be released to the community for external review at the beginning of March. A special call was scheduled (February 11) to further develop the next topic's scope and continue to plan for the interactive workshop scheduled for the AIRA conference. The MIROW SC has decided to send out a request to the community for volunteers for the next topic. An announcement will go out later this month with more details.
