# USING INFORMATION AND COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGY (ICT) TO IMPROVE IMMUNIZATION PROGRAMS

In November, Rebecca Coyle attended a stakeholder meeting in Istanbul, Turkey. Ninety-five people representing ministries of health, WHO, UNICEF, CDC, Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, Gavi the Vaccine Alliance, and many other stakeholders and partners met to:

- 1. Share experiences concerning the use of information and communication technology (ICT) in immunization programs
- 2. Brainstorm possibilities for future use and introduction of innovation
- 3. Consult on the roles that WHO should play to enable adoption of promising technologies, focusing on WHO's normative function around data standards, as well as on its advisory function concerning use of data, and managing innovation for scalable and sustainable outcomes.

Many of the discussions centered on tools and projects dedicated to reporting systems, logistics management information systems, electronic immunization registries, and underused technologies such as geographical information systems. While discussions and presentations on these topics showed a lot of progress and potential, challenges remain to scale up and sustain the use of appropriate technologies in the lowest income countries. Not uncommon to the discussions within the United States, participants agreed that updated guidance is



needed around data standards, the use of data for decision making, and the use of information systems including new technologies. Four subgroups discussed the kind of guidance that would be useful in the areas of program performance monitoring, data for supply chain management, electronic immunization registries, and barriers towards integration and interoperability. Common threads across these groups were the need to invest not only in technology, but also in the people and the processes that make data useful. Data collection needs to be more directly linked to data use or data-driven decision-making especially at the district or health facility level.

While the focus of the discussion was on the global community, the struggles and challenges that other countries shared were very similar to the discussion we continue to have here in the U.S. In the coming months, WHO will take the lead on further developing guidance and creating a platform to facilitate the exchange of ideas and experiences in implementing ICT systems. As information emerges, AIRA will continue to share the ideas and experiences with our community.

# **NOVEMBER RECAP**

#### **Assessment Steering Committee**

• The ASC met on November 4<sup>th</sup>, 2014. The ASC decided to create a guide that would direct any individual or IIS through the decisions that need to be made to conduct coverage assessments using an IIS. A small working group of subject matter experts has been created to work on this project.

#### Standards and Interoperability Steering Committee

- The SISC met on November 12<sup>th</sup>, 2014. The SISC work plan was reviewed, discussed and collectively edited as a group.
- The SISC Charter will be updated by Rob and Mary, and will be shared with the group for review before the next meeting, with the hopes that it can be approved by the full steering committee.
- The IG is published and available on the CDC website. There are some small issues that
  have been found that require fine-tuning, and it is anticipated that more will be found
  as the guide gets used across the community.

#### **Education Steering Committee**

- The ESC met on November 19<sup>th</sup>, 2014. ESC members discussed comments received on the Training Resources for IIS Trainers document. Committee members were asked to submit any additional comments by Friday, November 21. The document will be finalized and posted to the AIRA website.
- ESC members discussed the IIS-AFIX webinar scheduled for December 2. Additionally, ESC members reviewed the following topics for future webinars that were suggested in the Education Survey: data quality, data format, data accuracy, technical capacity, system architecture and design, cross-jurisdictional data sharing, and privacy and confidentiality.

#### **MIROW Steering Committee**

The MIROW Steering Committee met on November 20<sup>th</sup>, 2014. The steering committee
discussed the patient active/inactive status topic guide, the topic for the next
development cycle, MIROW activities at the AIRA 2015 National Meeting, evaluation of
MIROW guides, and continued discussions on the development approach going
forward.
