

Walgreens Immunization Services: Where We Stand Today


- Largest American immunization provider outside of the federal government with over 27,000 trained health care professionals
- Over 8,100 Walgreens points of care nationwide providing all CDC recommended adult and adolescent vaccines authorized by state law
- Administered over 7M flu and 1.5M non-flu immunizations during 2012-2013 season
- Expanding Travel Health services to over 350 locations



Walgreens Immunization Services: Private-Public Partnerships

- Partnered with HHS to donate more than 900,000 flu vouchers since 2010
- State Supplied Vaccine Programs
 - Administered over 3,000 state supplied flu vaccine to Rhode Island adult residents in 2012
 - Partnered with the Washington State Department of Health to administer over 28,000 state supplied Tdap immunizations during 2012
- Collaborated with City of Chicago to increase influenza vaccination rates 4 fold during "Vaccinate Chicago Week" in 2012
- "Get A Shot Give A Shot" 2013 Campaign: donating nearly 3 million Polio and Measles vaccines through the United Nations Foundation





Walgreens Immunization Services

Current State

Flu Program

- Expanded the role of the pharmacist in providing clinical services
- Vaccinations provided annually fluctuate due to increased competition and flu incidence

Non-Flu Immunization Program

- Leveraged flu program to screen patients and recommend other immunizations (e.g. Shingles, Pneumonia, Tdap)
- Increased awareness of preventative health services using "Walgreens immunization assessment tool"

Future State

Preventative Care / Immunization Services

- Expand state privileges to offer all immunizations
- Expand payer access for all preventative services offered at a community pharmacy
- Expand implementation of innovative immunization programs

2007 - 2008

- Connected to 5 state immunization registries
- Weekly Data Transfer via Flat File


2009 - 2012

- Connected to 15 state and municipal immunization registries
- Weekly Data Transfer via Flat File


Today

- Partnered with Surescripts in 2012
- Connected to 36 state and local immunization registries; 11 registries are under development
- Daily Data Transfer via HL-7
- Successfully transmitted nearly 3 million records since August 2012

Immunization Registry Reporting: Challenges and Learnings

Resource Constraints

- State Budget Cuts / Limited Registry Resources
- Extended Implementation Process (up to 6 months in some cases)

CDC Implementation Guide (2.3.1 vs. 2.5.1)

• Registries following variations of CDC Implementation Guide

Variations Of Acknowledgement Messages

- Acknowledgement messages vary from registry to registry
- Difficult to automate correction and resubmission process

Facility IDs Standardization


- Certain registries utilize state assigned facility IDs
- Others utilize NPI numbers

Patient Consent

- State specific patient opt-in forms to capture consent to reporting
- Opt-out procedures vary from registry to registry

Closing Remarks

- Walgreens is transforming the role of community pharmacy and providing additional healthcare services such as immunizations
- Collaborating with healthcare providers, health plans and state and local government agencies to lower overall healthcare costs

- Registry bi-directional query functionality and immunization forecasting under development
