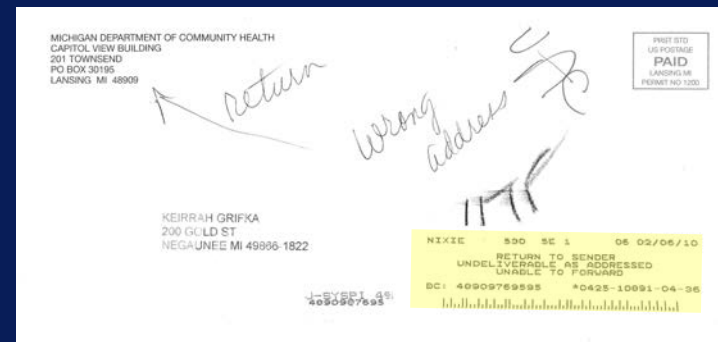
Reminder / Recall Use

Reminder / Recall Considerations

- Reminder / recall is an effective method to increase vaccination rates
- Several important perspectives:
 - Health departments
 - Private providers
 - Parents

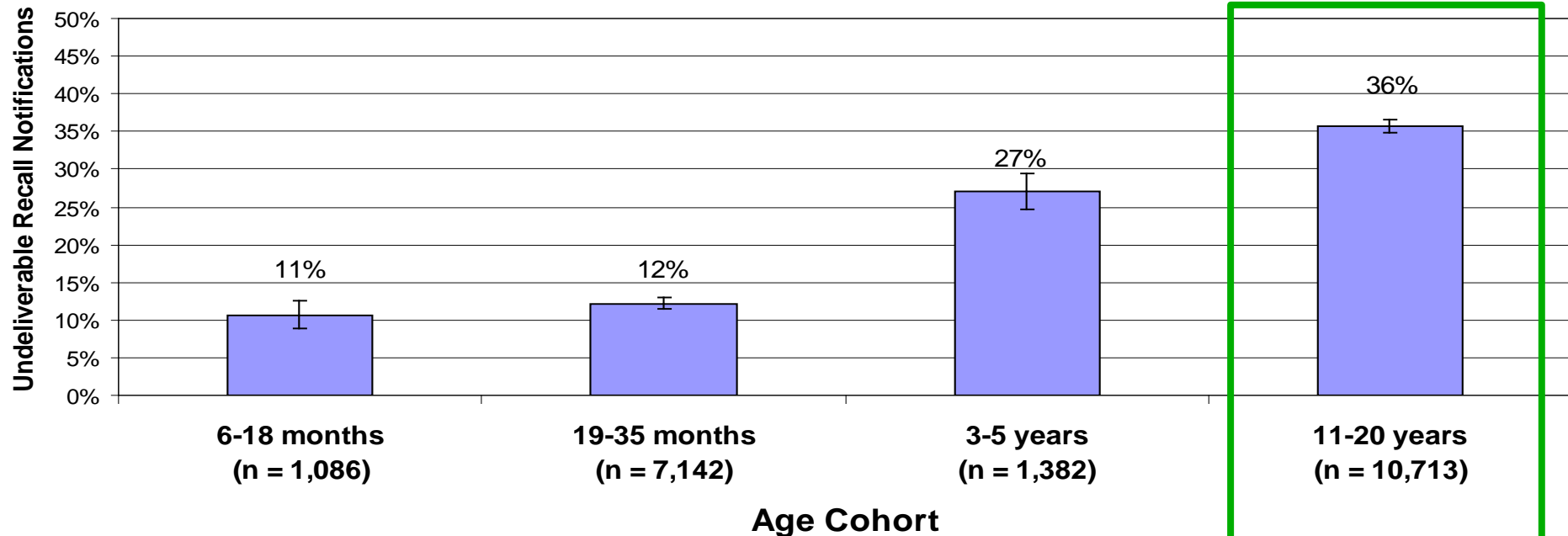
Health Departments

- Used widely by local health departments:
 - LHD immunization clinic clients
 - LHD jurisdiction residents
- Telephone / postal mail commonly used
- Can be a labor intensive process
- Undeliverable reminder / recall notices are commonplace



Undeliverable Recall Notifications

N = 20,323 Recalls



Private Providers

- Sustained IIS-based reminder / recall is difficult for many practices:
 - 20 practices in SE Michigan
 - Goal: 4 quarterly recall cycles in 12 months
 - Assessed labor costs and barriers identified by staff

Private Providers

- 16 practices conducted at least 1 recall:
 - ≥ 4 recalls: 9 practices
 - 3 recalls: 2 practices
 - 2 recalls: 3 practices
 - 1 recall: 2 practices
- IIS-based reminder / recall is difficult for many practices:
 - time constraints
 - staff turnover
 - difficulties with recall execution

Parent Perspectives

Parent Perspectives

- What form of reminder / recall notices do parents want?
- How stable is parent contact information?
- What types of reminders are practices able to send?

Parent Perspectives

- National perspective:
 - Web-based survey (2010) of parents of children 0-17 years
 - Stability of communication information
 - Willingness to register for immunization messaging

Parent Perspectives

- 1 in 4 parents prefer new technologies for reminders
- Most (56%) were willing to register their cell phone number for future immunization messages
- Email address less likely to have a recent change

Parent Perspectives

- Practice-based perspective
- Five provider sites (n=1,275 surveys):
 - 53% private practices
 - 47% LHDs

Parent Perspectives

- Respondents indicated interest in receiving reminders via:
 - telephone (59%)
 - email (45%)
 - text messages (28%)
 - no reminder (7%)
- Text or email reminders tended to be higher among younger respondents

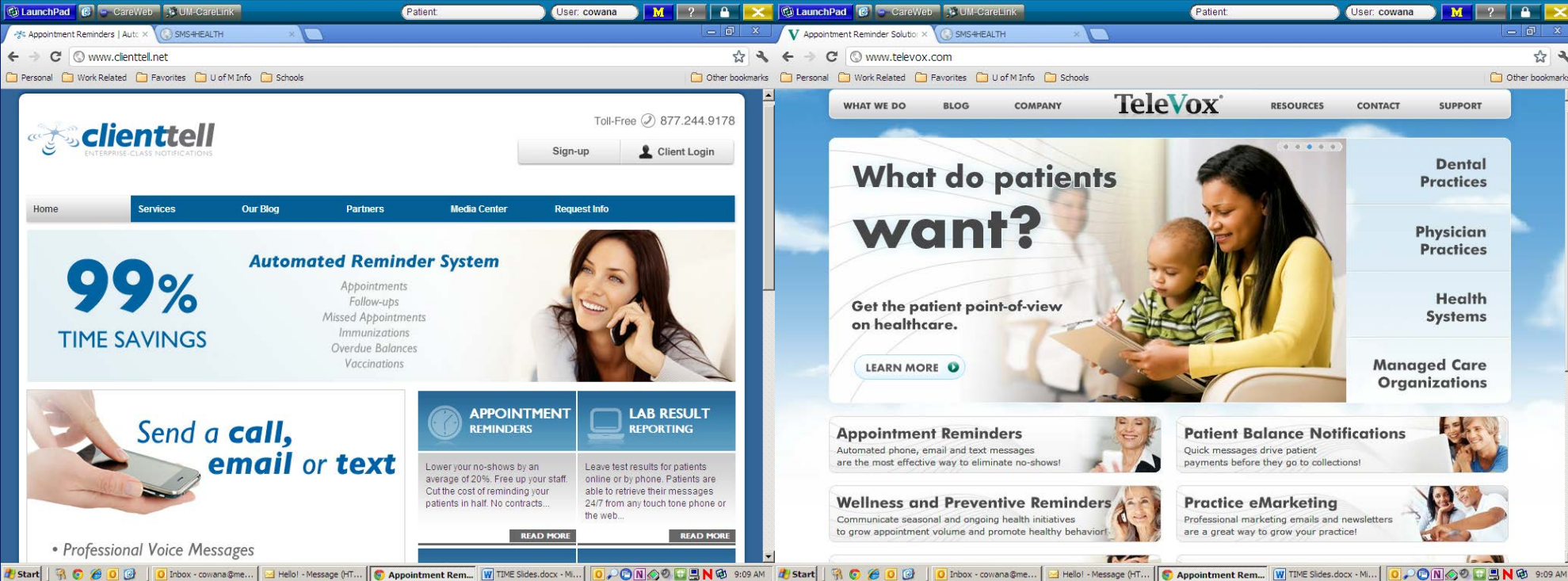
Parent Perspectives

- Most respondents indicated preferences for reminders that include email or text messaging
- Many preferred to receive reminders *only* by email or text (34%)
- Others preferred these technologies in combination with a telephone call (27%)

If many parents prefer electronic reminders,
can practices send them?

Provider Readiness

- Providers currently rely primarily on telephone or postal mail for reminders
- 3rd party vendors used for autodialer reminders
- These same vendors also support text, email messaging

The “Tipping Point”?

- Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health Act, or HITECH Act (2009)
- American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009
- “ to promote the adoption and *meaningful use* of health information technology.....”

Meaningful Use

- EHR use in a meaningful manner, e.g.,:
 - demographics, vital signs, problem list,
 - e-prescribing
 - computerized physician order entry (CPOE)
 - active medication list
 - clinical decision support (CDS) rules
 - patient portals
 - patient reminders
 - submitting data to registries / IIS

Patient Reminders

- Send patient reminders for preventive or follow up care per their preference....
 - Appointments
 - Immunizations

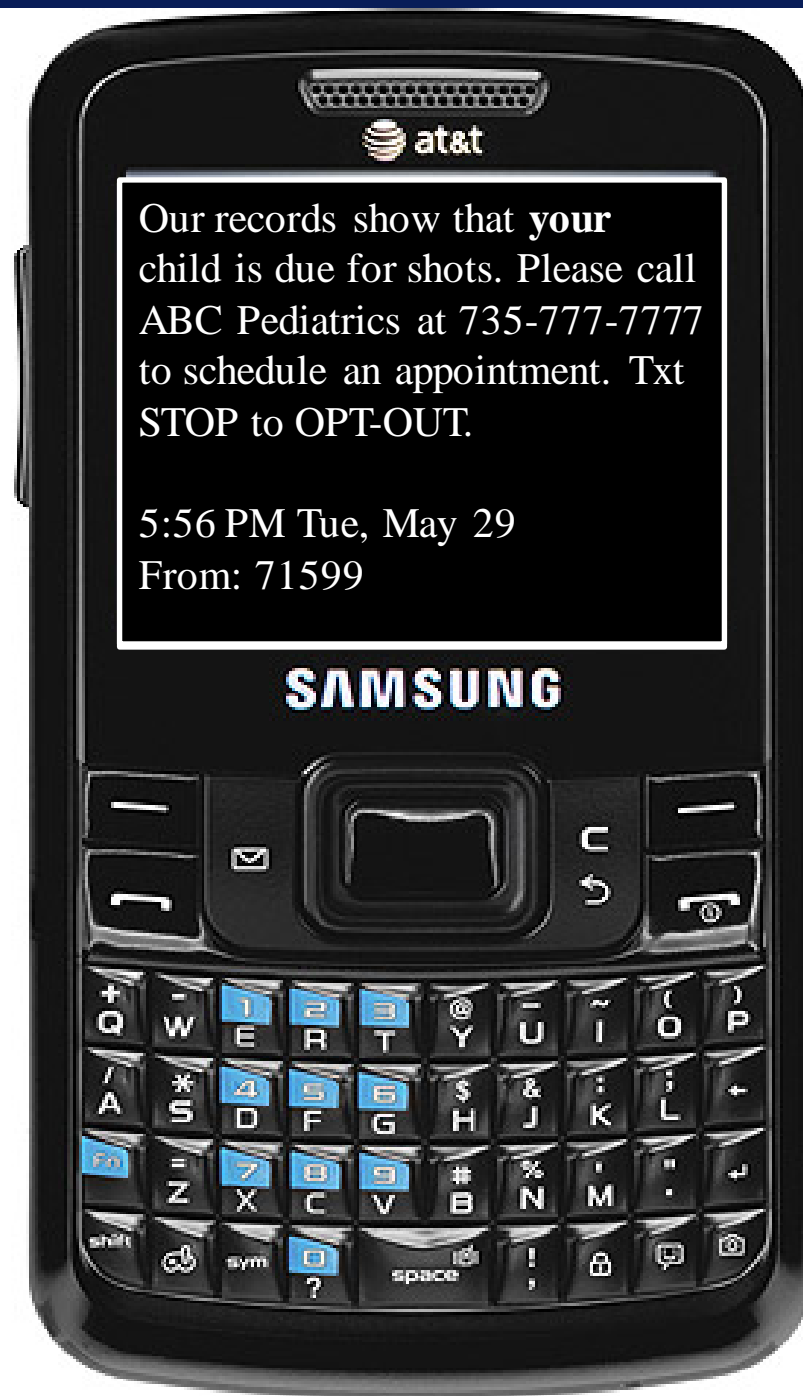
As a reminder, we are encouraging all parents to keep their adolescent (11 through 17 years) up-to-date on recommended vaccines, including tetanus-diphtheria -acellular pertussis (Tdap), meningococcal conjugate (MCV4 or meningitis) and human papillomavirus (HPV4). **Our records indicate that your child currently needs one or more of these vaccines.**

Vaccination is the best way to protect your child from getting many preventable diseases.

Patient Reminder Challenges



- Tracking alternative contact information:
 - is not typical
 - often not integrated with patient registration and clinical information
 - patient preferences not typically tracked

Patient Reminder Challenges



- How should practices assess vaccination status for reminder / recall?
- Which rules should be used?
 - EHR vendor?
 - IIS?
 - other options?

EHR Data Sharing Challenges

- EHR interoperability \neq bi-directional interoperability
- What does 'bi-directional' interoperability entail?
 - Sending doses from IIS to EHR?
 - Sending assessment of vaccination status to EHR?

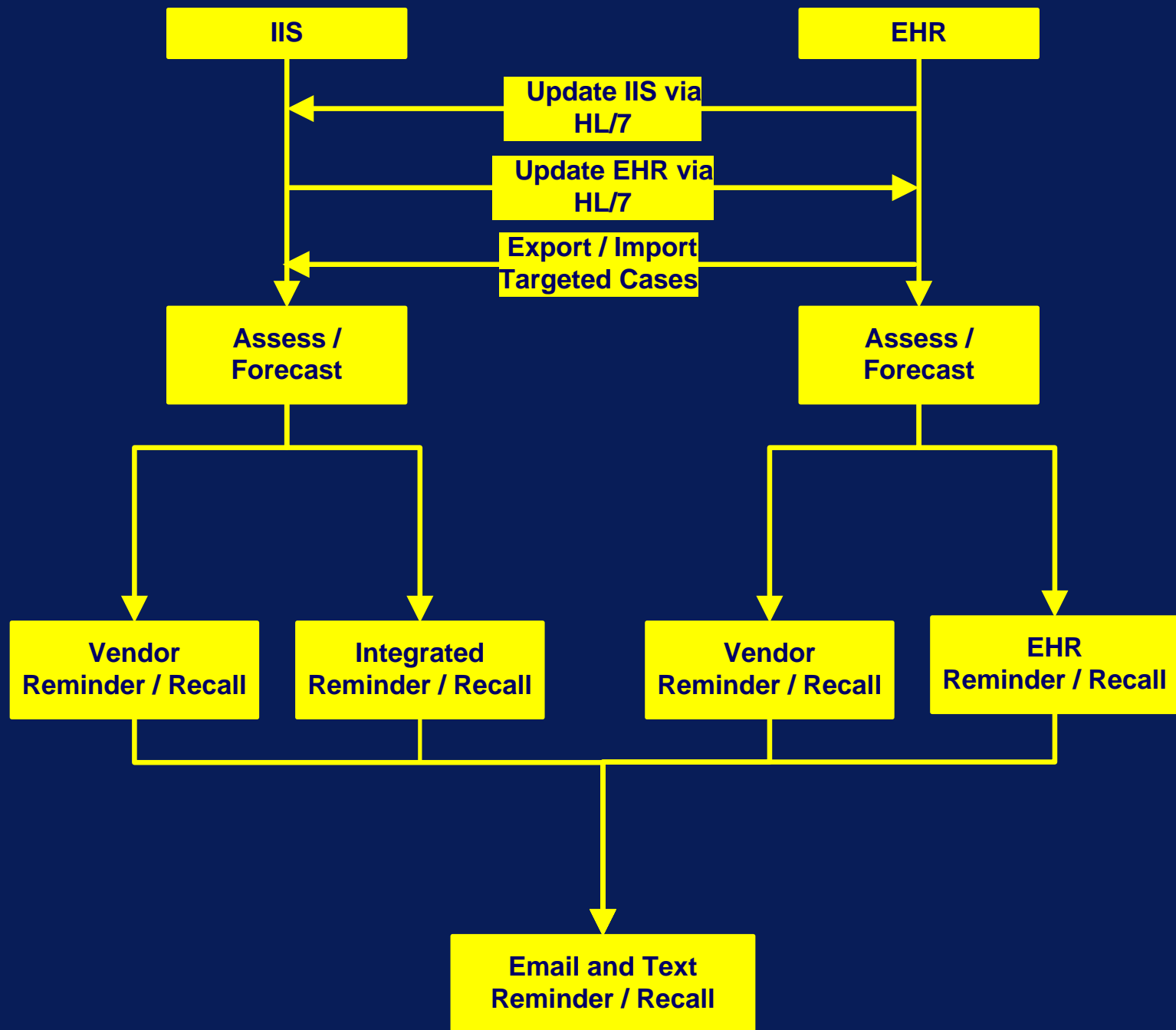


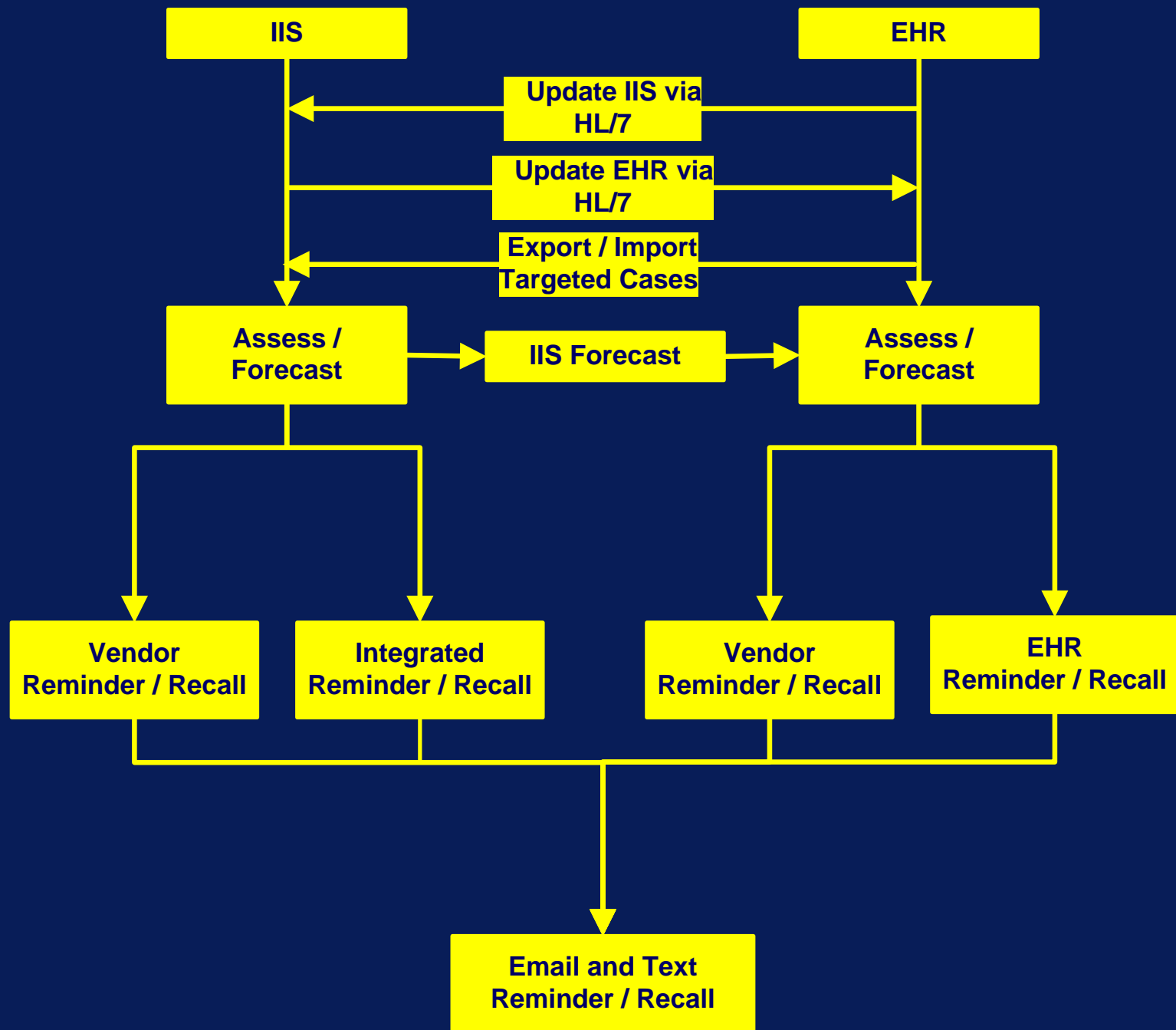












Opportunities

- There are important opportunities to ensure the continued relevance of IIS

Opportunities

- Real-time bi-directional IIS/EHR interoperability
- Coordination of forecasting methods
- Mechanisms to foster IIS reminder / recall flexibility:
 - Import information from EHR for targeted conditions
 - Export cases to vendor systems, per patient preferences for reminders
