- "The model by which ONC will coordinate the identification, assessment and determination of the "best available" interoperability standards and implementation specifications for industry use to fulfill specific clinical health IT interoperability needs."

Standards Advisory, Section 1-D

- The Advisory cites the OMB standards (900+ codes) for race and ethnicity data, but notes that high-level race/ethnicity categories may be suitable for statistical or epidemiological purposes.
- AIRA asks that IIS be called out and identified under this bullet point within Limitations, Dependencies, and Preconditions for Consideration section (i.e., specifying that IIS [or systems such as IIS] can use the abridged code set).

Standards Advisory, Section 1-H

- The advisory cites CVX as a standard code set for administered immunizations.
- AIRA is recommending that if CVX is listed as a code set for administered immunizations, MVX should be listed as well (as it was for historical immunizations).

Standards Advisory, Section 1-H

- The advisory states in a bullet point that a) NDCs do not contain sufficient information to be used to document administered immunizations across organizations, and under the adoption column, states that b) NDCs are at the highest level (81-100%) for adoption.
- AIRA is recommending that a) the confusing bullet point regarding insufficient information be removed, and b) that adoption of NDCs would be more appropriately listed at the lower end of the scale.

Standards Advisory, Section 2-K

- The advisory states that the HL7 2.5.1 Implementation Guide, Release 1.5 is listed as "pilot", rather than "production", that the adoption level is at the lowest level (0-20%), and that it is unregulated.
- AIRA is recommending that a) the release 1.5 guide and addendum be listed in production, b) it be listed at 60-80% adoption, and c) it be listed as regulated now that Meaningful Use Stage 3 rules that reference it are published.

Standards Advisory, Section 3-A

- The advisory does not list SOAP/Web Services or the CDC WSDL as specifications under the section referencing "An unsolicited "push" of clinical health information to a known destination".
- AIRA is recommending that SOAP/Web Services and the CDC WSDL be referenced as the recognized transport specification for EHR-IIS Messaging.
