House Bill 832: Expanding the Role of Immunizing Pharmacists

- Passed on July 3, 2013
- Ability for immunizing pharmacists with a prescription, to administer the following CDC recommended vaccines to any person who is 18 years of age or older; following written protocols:
 - Pneumoccocal polysaccharide or pneumococcal conjugate vaccines
 - Zoster
 - Hep B
 - Meningococcal polysaccharide or meningococcal conjugate vaccines
 - Tetanus-diphtheria

House Bill 832: Expanding the Role of Immunizing Pharmacists

- Immunizing Pharmacists are also required to:
 - Access the NCIR prior to administering the vaccine or immunization.
 - Record vaccines administered to the patient within 72 hours after administration in the NCIR.
 - Notify the patient's primary care provider within 72 hours after administration of vaccine.

Roll Out and Training Plan

- NC Immunization Branch responsible for roll out and training
 - Aggressive timeline; no additional funding
 - Staggered roll out with phases for quality control
 - Set maximum number of stores allowed to join per phase
 - Monitoring periods in between
 - Pulled together team of "Account Executives" responsible for a specific pharmacy chain or group

Roll Out and Training Plan

- "Train-the-trainer" approach:
 - Attend webinars
 - Sign trainer agreement
 - Pass competency test
 - Collect store agreements
 - Train store(s) and users
 - Serve as point of contact for questions/trouble shooting moving forward


Stats

- ▶ 1,713 stores joined to date
 - Oct-Dec 2013: 1,351
 - Jan-Dec 2014: 274
 - Jan-Aug 2015: 76
- Over 5,000 users added
 - Pharmacy Administrator
 - Pharmacy Typical User


Stats

- Over 163,000 clients immunized
- Over 188,000 immunizations documented
 - Zoster $\approx 89,500$
 - Influenza $\approx 34,500$
 - Pneumo Conjugate ≈ 20,500
 - Pneumo Poly 23 ≈ 18,500
 - Td/Tdap $\approx 18,500$
 - Hep B ≈ 3,000
 - Meng ≈ 500
- Impact:
 - Influx of adult information added to the registry


Documented Adults in the NCIR



Documented Adult Immunizations 2012




Documented Adult Immunizations 2014

NCIR Stats

- Number of organizations: 3,488
 - 49% Pharmacies
 - 44% VFC
 - 7% Non-VFC
- Number of clients: 7.8 million (79% of NC pop.)
 - 109% of children 4 mos-5 yrs
 - 128% of adolescents 11–17 yrs
 - 63% of adults over 18 yrs
- Number of doses documented: 92 million
- Percent of NCIR clients with doses documented:
 - 91% of children 4 mos-5 yrs have at least 2 doses
 - 71% of adolescents 11–17 yrs have at least 2 adolescent doses
 - 51% of adults over 18 yrs have at least 1 adult dose

Current Status

- We are now in maintenance mode!
 - Biggest obstacles:
 - "Floating"/changing pharmacy staff
 - Upcoming annual contract renewal
- Transferring point of contact for pharmacies from Account Executives to Help Desk
- Future: Data Exchange
