  - Robert Wood Johnson grant funded the start-up of several state IIS




# STANDARDS & INTEROPERABILITY STEERING COMMITTEE

### **Committee Work**

- The purpose of the Committee is to:
- Provide technical support and guidance to interoperability efforts of AIRA members and the IIS community.
- Provide technical support and provide guidance to the board and Executive Director as they prepare to represent the IIS community in wider health information community regarding interoperability issues.
- Act as a liaison between national organizations involved with interoperability like ONC and others.
- Partner with CMS and others to identify federal Meaningful Use requirements that will provide opportunities to leverage IIS in support of interoperability and Meaningful Use.
- Be a technical authority and develop technical resources for AIRA members and the IIS community.
