
The Measurement and Improvement Initiative is a Phased, Rolling Process






Process for Validation




What happens at each stage?

Measurement and Improvement: Validation



Definition: Following the stages of Testing and Discovery and IIS Assessment, Validation is a summary stage to acknowledge IIS that are progressing toward or achieving alignment with community-selected measures. A Validation designation is automatically achieved when an IIS meets the designated measures and tests in a specific phase (e.g., Transport, Submission, etc.).

Validation Rollout

A "Validation" designation is automatically achieved when an IIS meets the designated* measures and tests in IIS Assessment

Review Data in IIS Assessment

Move to Validation

Quarterly Reports Show **Progress**

Meeting Validated Measures

- Three quarterly measurement cycles of data precede move to Validation
- Community will inform, MACAW will recommend, and Board will vote on proposed measures by phase *
- Quarterly reports demonstrate both program and community progress toward meeting measures
- IIS are recognized for achieving and making progress toward validation in each single phase


Validation Statuses, Explained






Nation-wide Validation Reports

- Include gradations of "validated with minor differences" and "major differences" to better demonstrate incremental progress.
- Include quarterly identified maps with gradations, with footnotes that clarify policy differences








Submission and Acknowledgement

2018 - 2022 Functional Standards

- Functional Standard 1.5: The IIS ensures that submitted vaccination and demographic data are processed and viewable in a timely manner.
- **Functional Standard 1.6:** The IIS assures the receipt, processing, and storage of demographic and vaccination data elements as endorsed by CDC.
- **Functional Standard 8.2**: The IIS receives submissions and returns acknowledgements consistent with the current CDC-endorsed HL7 Implementation Guide.


Proposed Query/Response Measures for Validation

Query and Response 2018 – 2022 Functional Standards

- Functional Standard 1.5: The IIS ensures that submitted vaccination and demographic data are processed and viewable in a timely manner.
- **Functional Standard 1.6:** The IIS assures the receipt, processing, and storage of demographic and vaccination data elements as endorsed by CDC.
- **Functional Standard 8.3:** The IIS receives queries from, and sends responses to, health information systems consistent with the current CDC-endorsed HL7 Implementation Guide.

Query and Response Trends - Q4 2017



Query and Response Proposed Basic and Complete Measures

Assessment Measure		Complete Level
1 - The IIS processes a query requesting a patient's immunization record.	X	X
2 - The IIS processes a query requesting a patient's evaluated immunization record and forecast.	X	X
3 - The IIS responds to a query for a known patient (one-to-one match).	X	X
4 - The IIS responds to a query for a patient that is not in the IIS.	X	X
6 - The IIS responds to a query that has a significant error that cannot be accepted.		X
7 - The IIS responds to a query for a known patient and returns known Core Data Elements.	Χ	X
8 - The IIS responds to a query with an RSP within 5 seconds or less for 95% of the queries submitted.		X

Query Measure 5


• The IIS responds to a query that results in multiple possible patients.

 Measure 5 is not being proposed to move to Validation at this time. To properly assess Measure 5 an intentional duplicate patient must be created in the IIS. To date, the AIRA Measurement and Improvement project has been unable to create this duplicate consistently across all participants leading to varied results and false negatives.
