How it works

Making a Good Thing Better



Examples

- Decreasing the amount of time, paper, and people involved in a business process like AFIX or provider enrollment.
- Decreasing the time and resources needed for IIS training.

- What support or tools would be helpful?



Sharing is Caring



Examples

- Use of SmartyStreets for address cleansing.
- Use CDC CDSi Logic or Vaccine Code Set Management Service (VCSMS).
- Partnerships with other states on joint development efforts.
- Templates, guides, white papers, training materials, etc.

- What other shared services (topics or tools) would be helpful for Immunization Programs?



Work with Stakeholders



Examples

- Securing 90/10; 75/25 or 50/50 Medicaid Match.
- Being funded by health plans, or Medicaid for HEDIS measurement.
- Partnering on training materials, sponsoring training events, or hosting and distributing IIS training materials.
