

ADVANCES IN EHR/IIS INTEROPERABILITY BY SELECT IMMUNIZATION PROGRAMS

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BACKGROUND PPHF INTEROPERABILITY COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT

Purpose

To build capacity for interoperability between IIS and provider EHR

Awardees

- 31 awardees
- Awards ranged from \$625K to \$2M (total of \$44M awarded)

Timeframe

- First awards were made in September 2014
- Projects took between 2 and 4 years to complete
- A total of 13 projects are ongoing

METHODS

Awardees built capacity in several approved areas

- Interoperability
- Onboarding

- Hardware / data storage / hosting
- Clinical decision support for immunizations (CDSi)

Note: Each awardee developed a unique plan for building capacity. Awardees focused on activities relevant to their jurisdiction.

Two months before the end of the project, awardees submitted an evaluation plan

Awardees submitted a final report based on the evaluation plan

EVALUATION PLAN TEMPLATE

CDC created an Evaluation Plan Template to quantify awardee activities and outcomes and to demonstrate the impact of the Cooperative Agreement

The template contained 4 sections:

- Activities and Accomplishments
- Provider Site Enhancements
- Data Quality Improvement
- Other Project Information

- Test New Software
- Plan for Sustainability

Onboarding


- Enhance Operations

UI/Flat File → **HL7 2.3.1**

Measures


- Change in number of vaccination and demographic records submitted to the IIS before and after the project
- Change in timeliness of vaccination records submitted to the IIS before and after the project

Time periods of interest (timeline not to scale)




DATA QUALITY: RECORDS SUBMITTED PRELIMINARY RESULTS — 12 AWARDEES REPRESENTED

CONCLUSIONS

Awardees demonstrated impact of the PPHF projects

- Awardees built interoperability capacity between IIS and provider EHR
- Number of vaccination and demographic records submitted to the IIS increased
- Vaccination records are submitted to the IIS more timely
- Each recipient benefitted directly with improvements to infrastructure and processes; many lessons learned were shared

Evaluation results will be useful into the future

- Inform existing and new interoperability and onboarding projects
- Connect awardees that have similar areas of interest
