

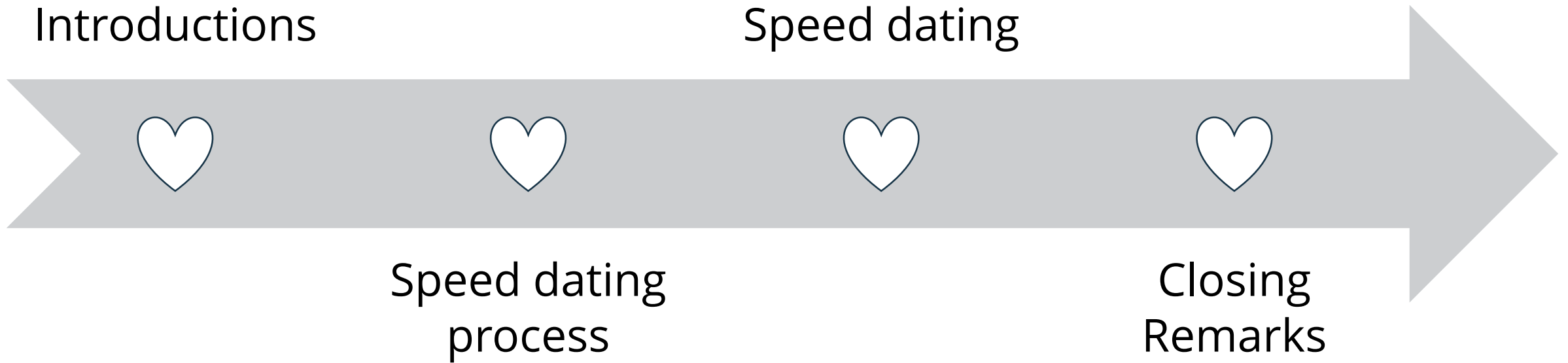

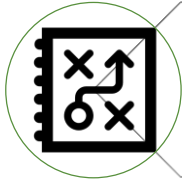


We love creating best practice recommendations

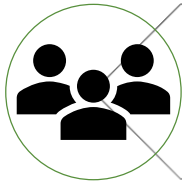
- Operational standards

Organizational support for in-person meetings from AIRA staff



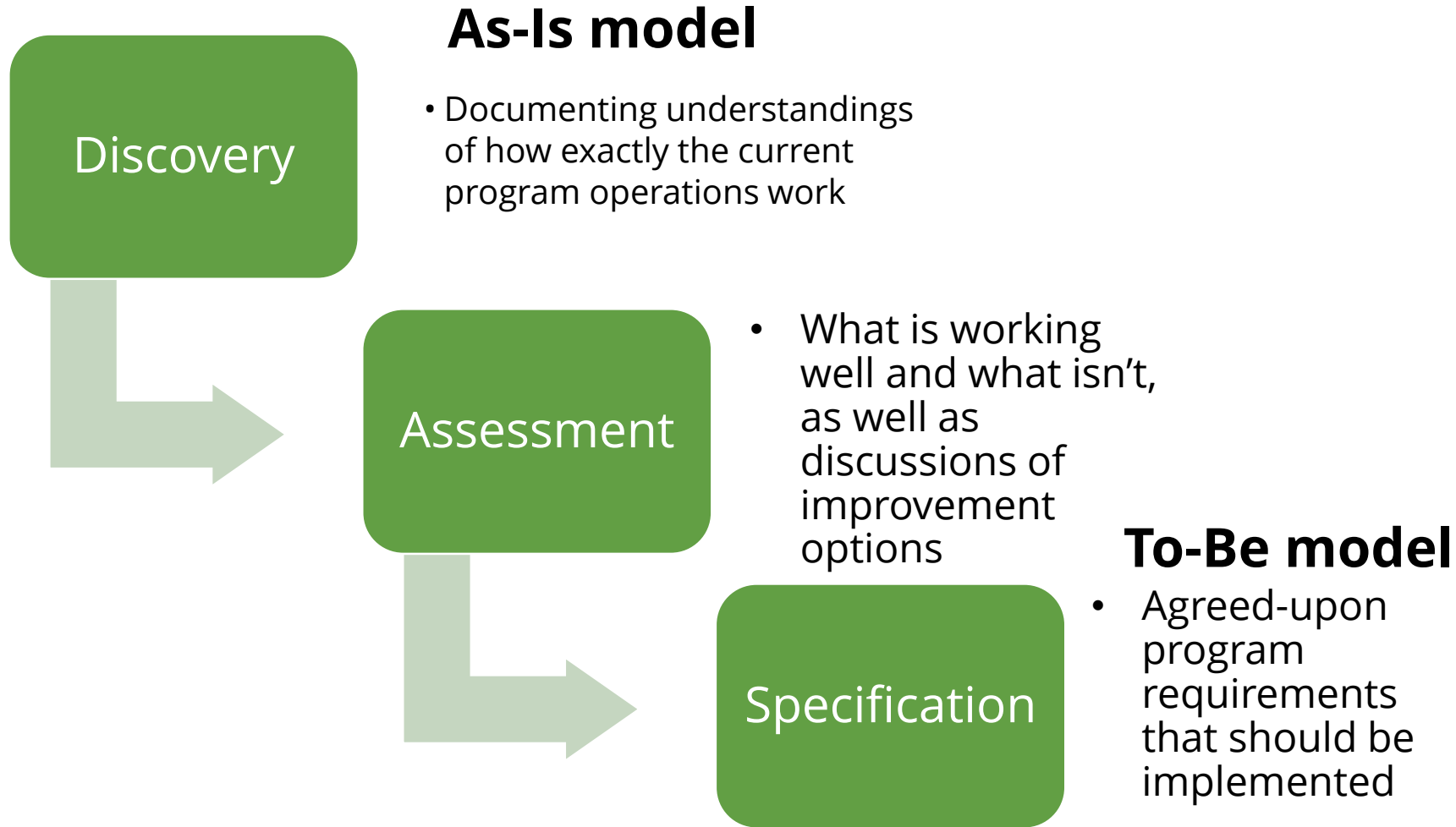

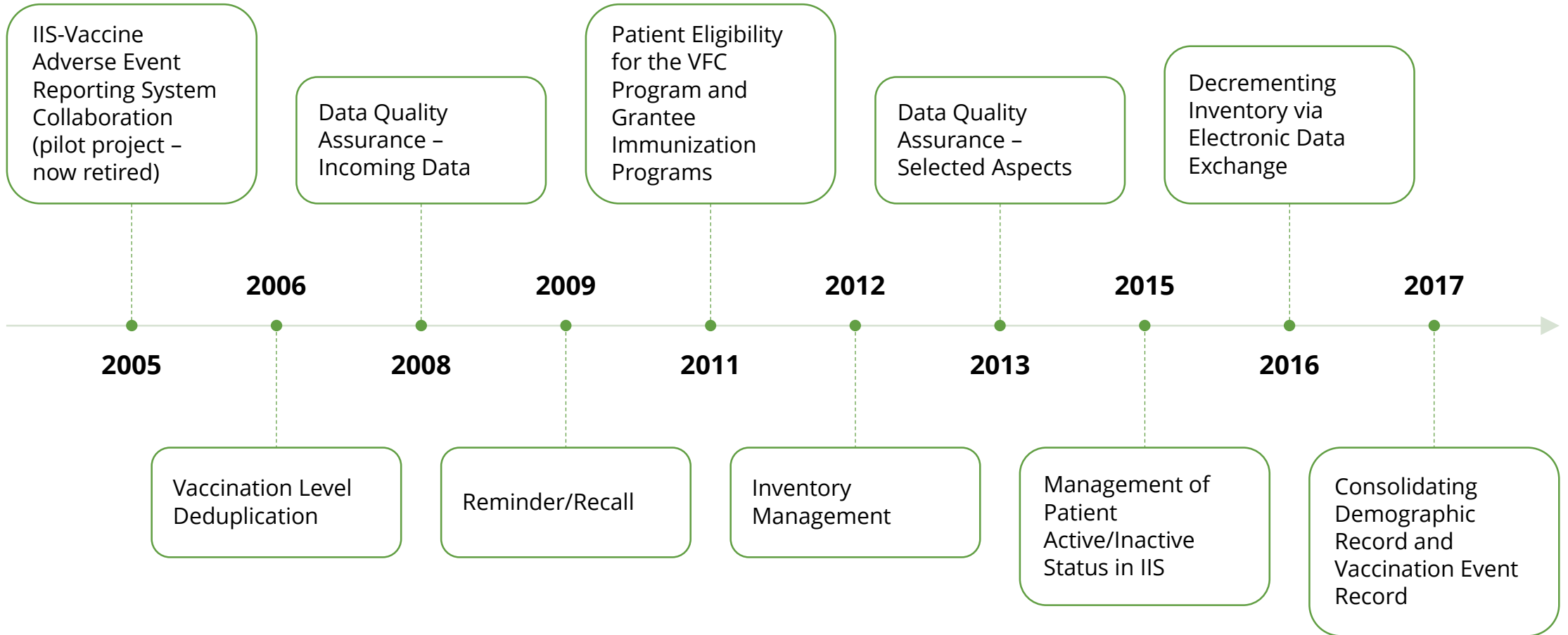

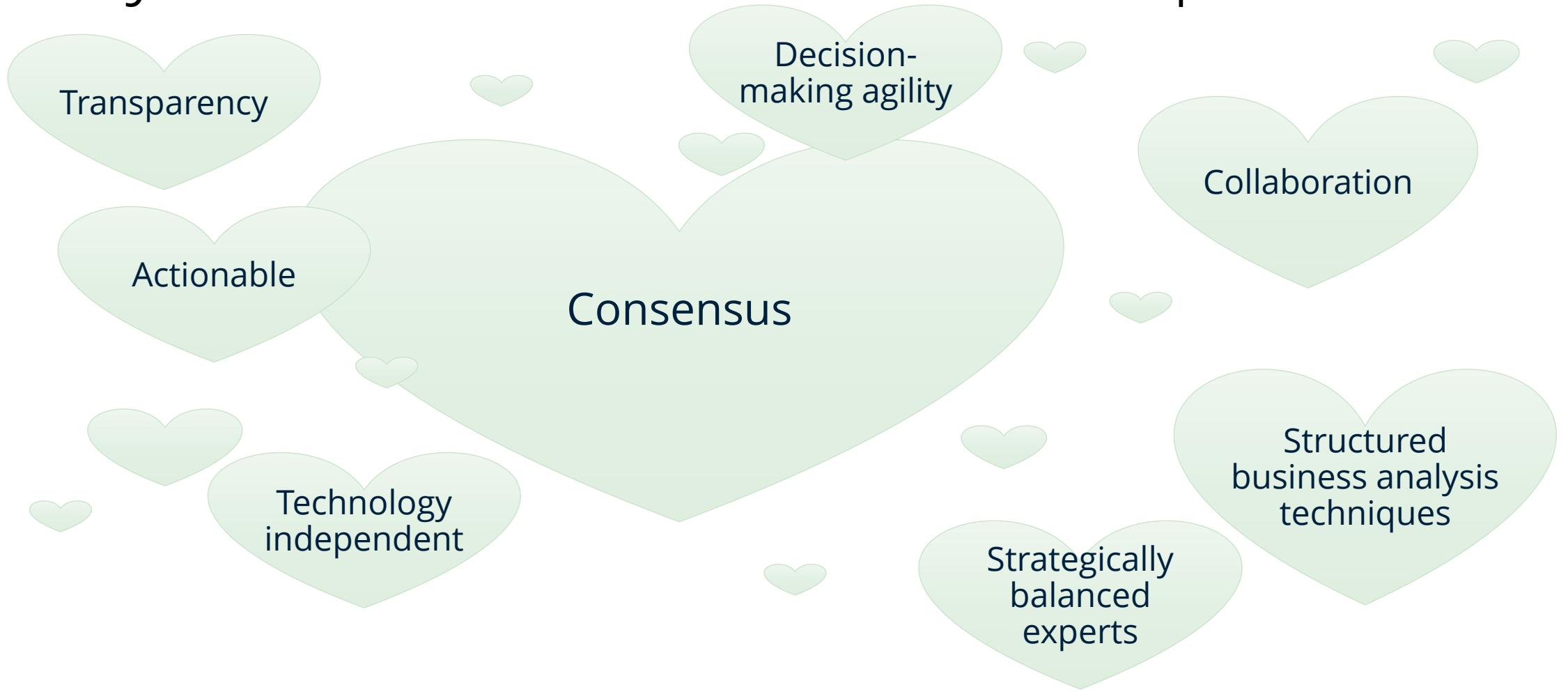
