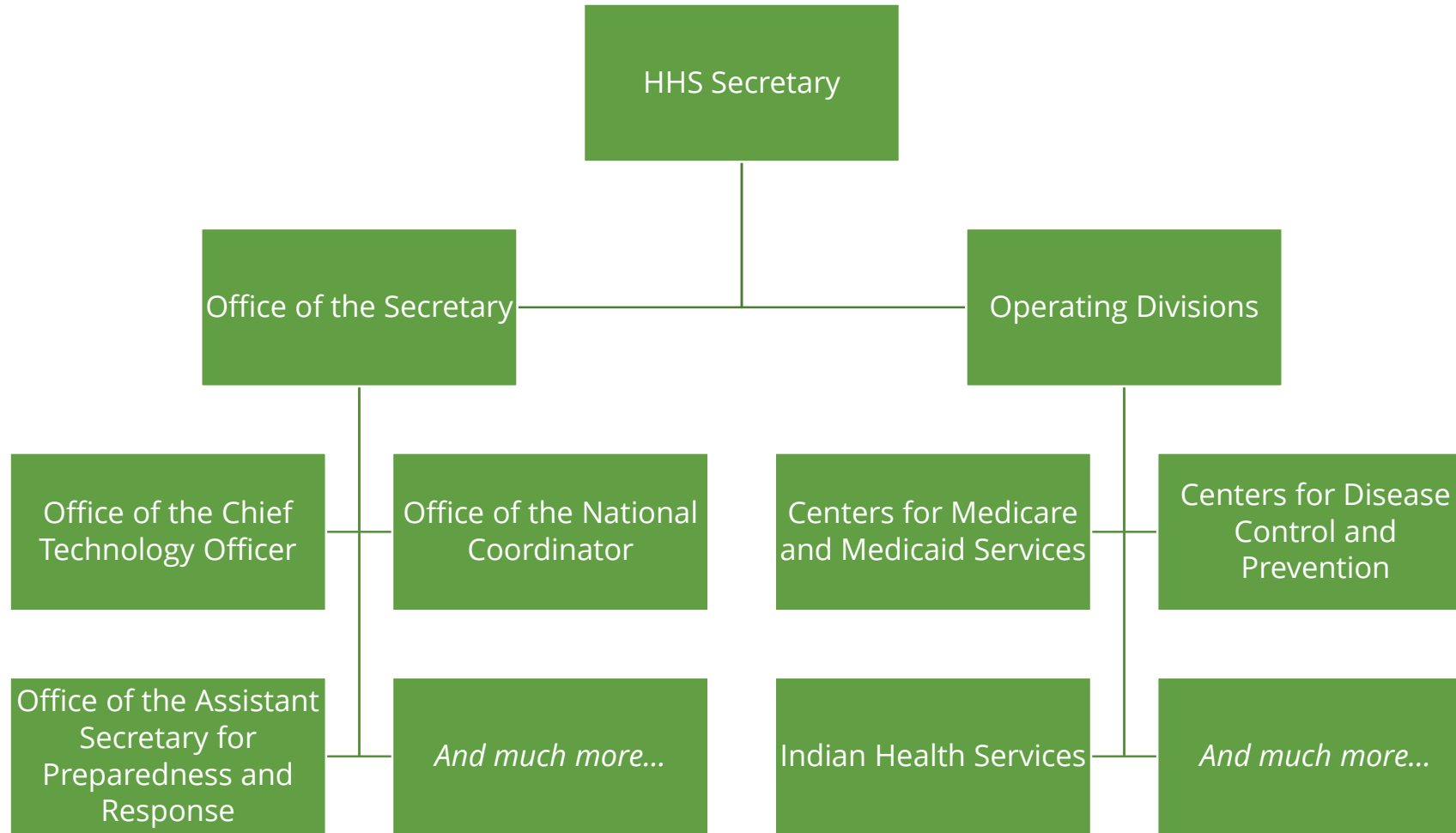

AIRA Discovery Session - Standards and Interoperability

February 25th, 2019



- For 2019 All PI programs point to 2015 Certification Rule
 - » “We, therefore, have adopted HL7 Version 2.5.1: Implementation Guide for Immunization Messaging, Release 1.5 (October 1, 2014) and HL7 Version 2.5.1: Implementation Guide for Immunization Messaging, Release 1.5, Addendum (July 2015) for the transmission to immunization requirement”¹ (p. 62663)
 - » “We have adopted the requirement for a Health IT Module to enable a user to request, access, and display a patient’s immunization history and forecast from an immunization registry in accordance with the Release 1.5 IG.”¹ (p. 62664)
- For 2019 all the PI programs use the concept of “active engagement” consistently.
- The onboarding process and reaching a state of “active engagement” are discrete from the PI programs.

- “Therefore, we have adopted the August 17, 2015 version of the CVX code set as the minimum standards code set for historical vaccines. For purposes of administered vaccines, we have adopted the National Drug Codes (NDC)— Vaccine NDC Linker, updates through August 17, 2015 as the minimum standards code set.”¹ (pp 62663-62664)

CMS: Promoting Interoperability Programs (PI)

- Formerly the EHR Incentive Program also known as Meaningful Use
- Four Promoting Interoperability Programs (each administered separately):
 - » IPPS (Hospital Inpatient Prospective Payment System)-Medicare
 - » QPP (Quality Payment Program)-Medicare MIPS Eligible Providers
 - » OPPS (Hospital Outpatient Prospective Payment System)-Medicare
 - » Medicaid EHR Incentive Program or State's Medicaid Promoting Interoperability Program

Promoting Interoperability Measure Sets for 2019

- For 2019, CMS has substantially revised objectives, measures, and scoring across these programs, as well as requiring use of 2015 Edition certified health IT
 - » ePrescribing
 - » Health Information Exchange
 - » Provider to Patient Exchange
 - » **Public Health and Clinical Data Exchange** (formerly Public Health and Clinical Data Registry Reporting measures)

Public Health and Clinical Data Exchange Objective

- Objective
 - » Measures that an eligible hospital, critical access hospital, or MIPS eligible clinician attests yes to being in active engagement with a public health agency (PHA) or clinical data registry (CDR) to submit electronic public health data in a meaningful way using certified electronic health record technology (CEHRT) for two measures within the objective.
- Measures
 - » **Immunization Registry Reporting**
 - » **Syndromic Surveillance Reporting**
 - » **Electronic Case Reporting**
 - » Public Health Registry Reporting
 - » Clinical Data Registry Reporting
 - » **Electronic Reportable Lab (ELR) Result Reporting (EHs and CAHs only)**

Checklist Item	Your IIS Status	Work Remaining/Level of Effort/ Notes
TECHNICAL Checklist		
NIST 2015 Submission (VXU) Test Messages: Effective January 1, 2019, providers wishing to receive incentive payments through the Promoting Interoperability incentive program must use Electronic Health Record Systems (EHRs) that meet 2015 Certified EHR Technology (CEHRT). To meet 2015 CEHRT criteria, EHRs are required to generate 6 VXU		

Take Home Points:

- EHR requirement for 2015 CEHRT
- Acceptance of NDCs
- Sending conformant ACK messages
- Acceptance of queries
- Sending conformant RSP (response) messages
- Limit HL7 constraints, eliminate HL7 conflicts
- Offer SOAP/WS, CDC WSDL
- Be prepared for audits



Promoting Interoperability (PI) Incentive Program Readiness Checklist for IIS

Updated January 2019

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Accept National Drug Codes (NDC) for Administered Vaccines: Promoting Interoperability requires the use of NDC for administered vaccines. Historical vaccines continue to use CVX codes. ⁴ IIS need to be able to accept and process NDC ⁵ for administered vaccines. CDC maintains tables for these code sets, along with crosswalk tables between CVX and NDC, and NDC Unit of Use (UoU) and NDC Unit of Sale (UoS). For more guidance on UoU and UoS NDCs, refer to CDC's Updated Guidance for Documenting Vaccine NDCs and Lot Numbers in IISs and EHRs. ⁶

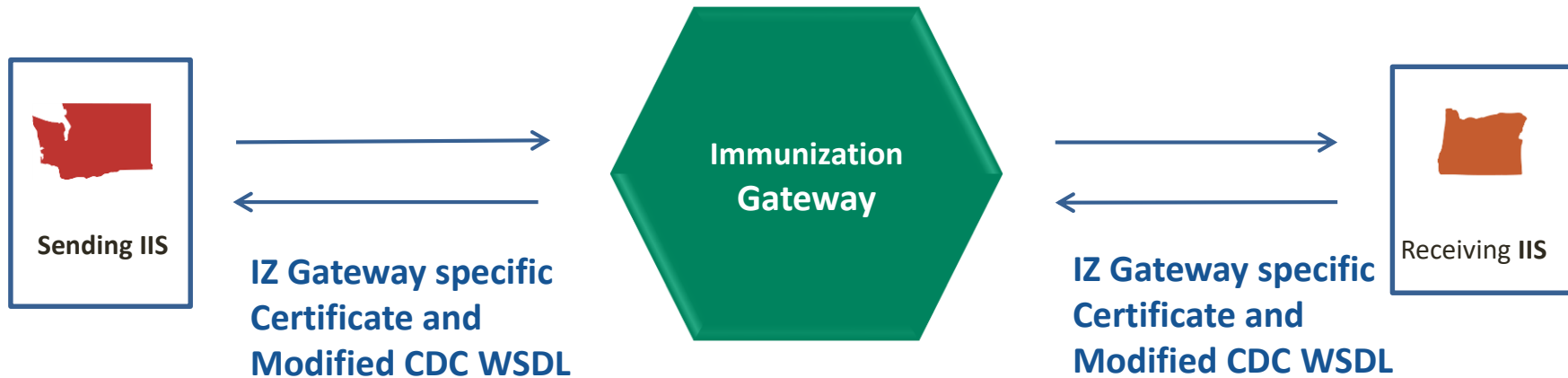

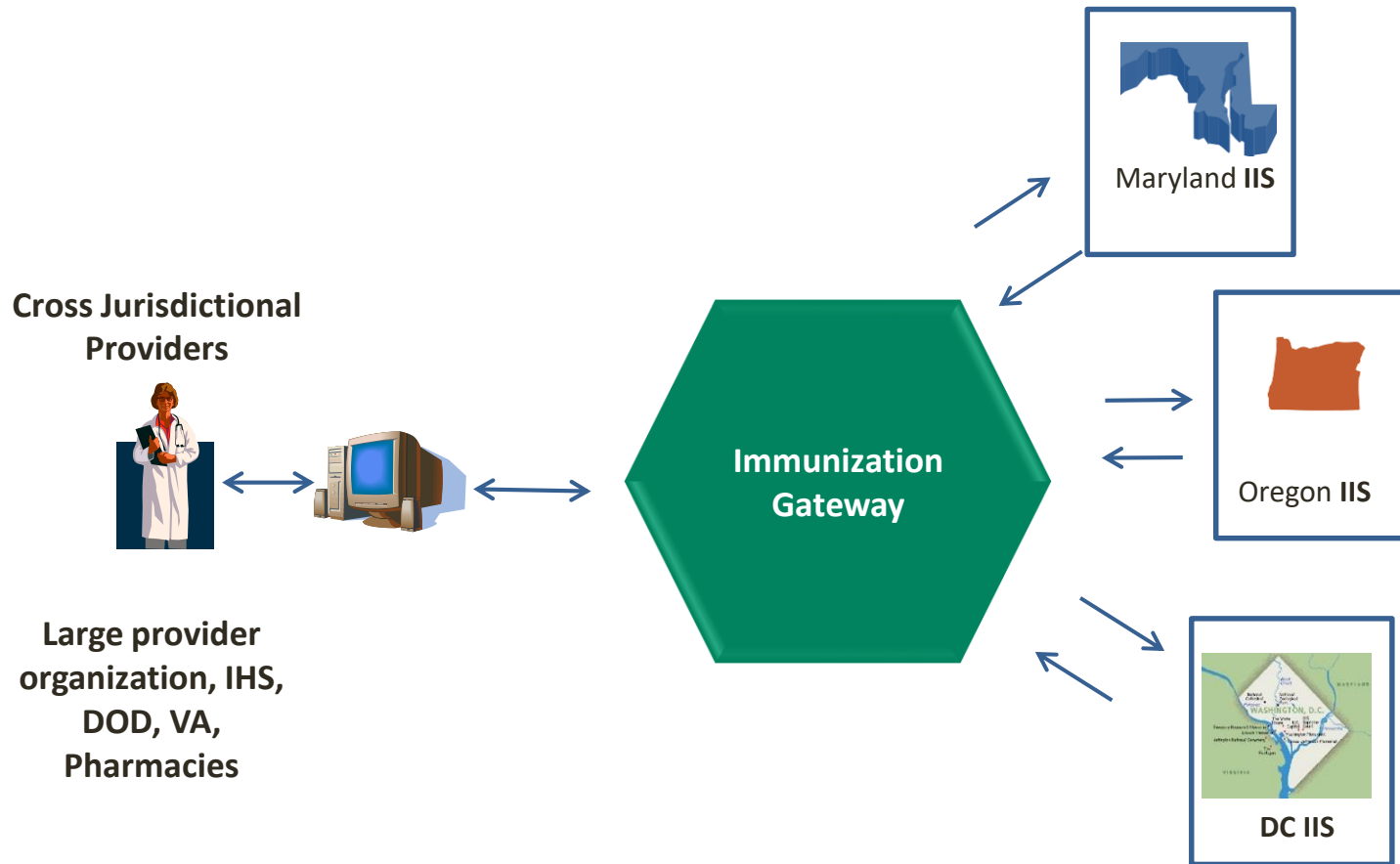
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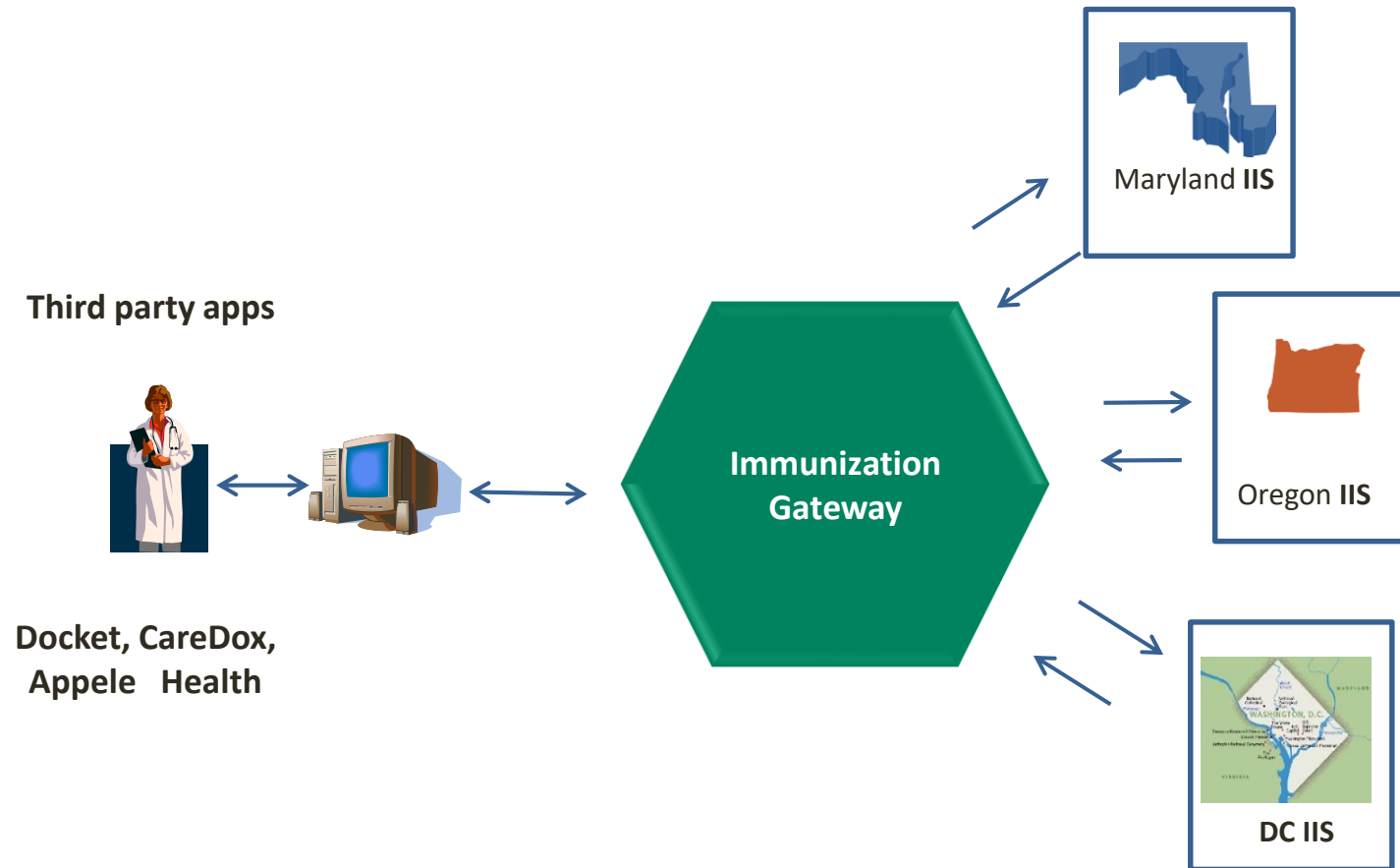
New Immunization Gateway Architecture

- Support HL7 2.5.1 release 1.5
- Support single account for IZ Gateway
- Recognize sender through MSH segments
- Support cross-jurisdictional data as historical

IZ Gateway Functions - Cross Jurisdictional Exchange

IZ Gateway will enforce trading partner agreements

IZ Gateway will support transformations from providers as needed

IZ Gateway will support pre-onboarding

- Support single account for IZ Gateway
- Recognize sender through MSH segments

Exchange between IIS	Initiate message	Gateway specific client side certificate	Single IZ Gateway Account to IIS	Automatic and manual triggers; send queries and updates
Exchange between IIS	Receive/respond	Existing IIS server side certificate	Single Gateway Account to IIS	Recognize messages as historical; identify sender through MSH segments
Exchange with multi-jurisdictional provider (DoD, VA, Indian Health Services)	Receive/respond	Existing IIS server side certificate	Single Gateway Account to IIS	Identify sender through MSH segments
Consumer Access connection for third party apps	Receive query only/respond	Existing IIS server side certificate	Single Gateway Account to IIS	Identify sender through MSH segments



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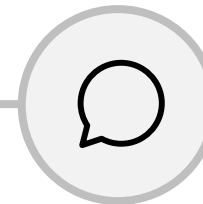
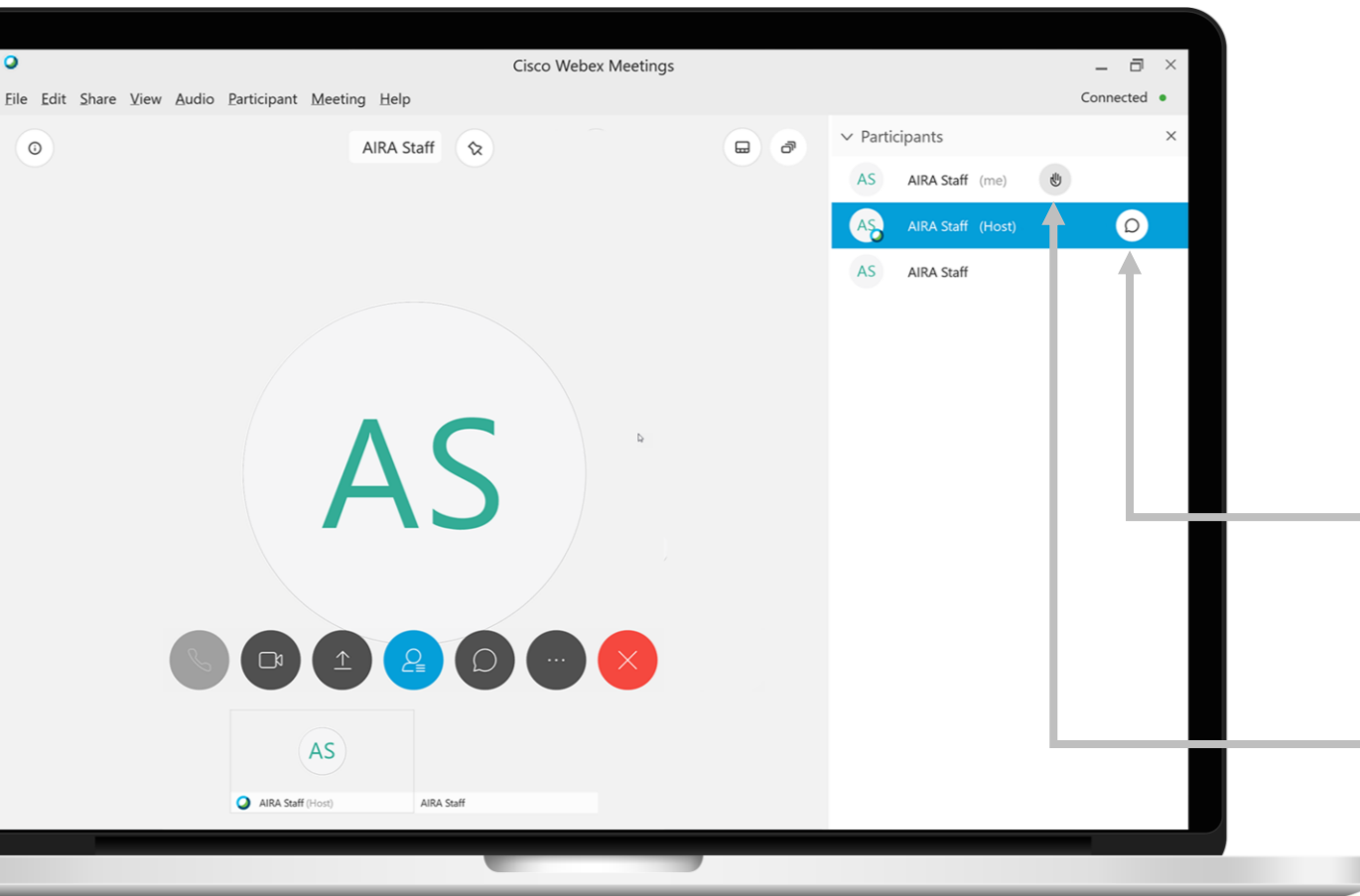

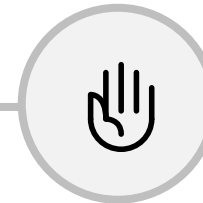
