







COVID-19 and Routine Vac Diphtheria What does CDC advise about administering recommended immunizations to children and teens when COVID-19 is circulating? Documenting Vaccination It is important to assess the vaccination status of all children and adolescents at each patient visit to avoid missed opportunities for vaccination and ensure timely vaccine catch-up. All vaccines due or overdue should be administered according to the recommended CDC immunization schedules during that visit, unless a specific contraindication exists, to provide protection as soon as possible and minimize the Hepatitis A number of healthcare visits needed to complete vaccination. Hepatitis B Due to COVID-19 in my community, many children in my practice missed well-child visits or were seen only on a telemedicine visit and need to be caught up on recommended vaccinations. Resources for Developing Mass Vaccination Clinics

Mass vaccination clinics involve the administration of vaccine(s) to a large number of people over a relatively short period of time, allowing providers to rapidly and efficiently immunize communities. Due to the unique nature of mass vaccination clinics, they frequently are held in non-traditional or temporary settings, such as in parking lots or large indoor spaces. Patient flow may be managed through a variety of venues, such as walk-through, drive-through, and curbside clinics, or by using mobile medical units.

This listing from the Immunization Action Coalition offers access to guidance documents, toolkits, and other helpful resources, produced over a span of many years, and to information that can be adapted to meet the needs of your mass vaccination program and planned clinic locations. Please keep in mind that many of the guidance documents listed below were created in the past and will need to be modified to ensure additional protections are implemented (e.g., social distancing and wearing protective equipment such as masks, face shields, goggles, and gloves, where appropriate) to safeguard staff and patients from COVID-19.






