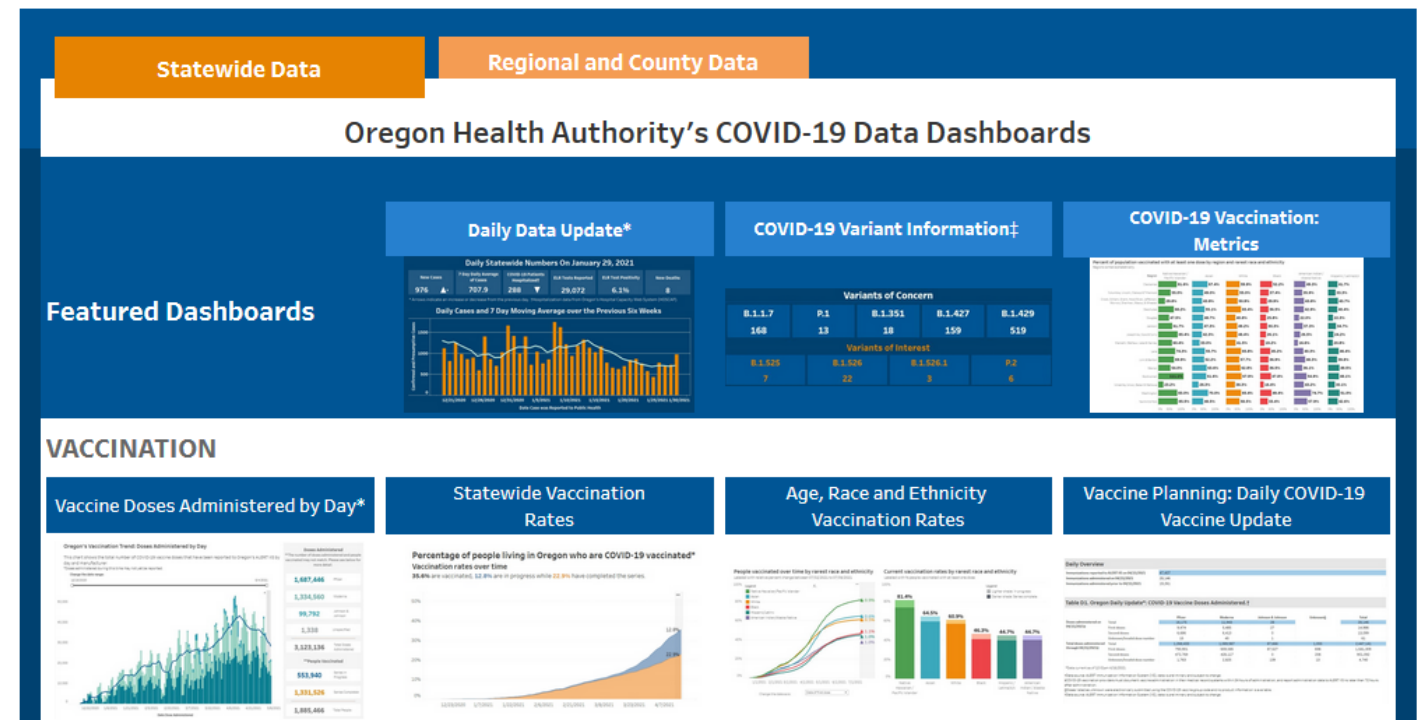
Data are refreshed daily, organized & cited for users

- Programs within Oregon Health Authority (OHA) develop reports and data analysis both with and without Tableau before the pandemic
- Daily reporting required by the pandemic shifts COVID-19 reporting primarily to Tableau and results in the development of **many** dashboards
- **OHA COVID-19 Table of Contents** organizes dashboards to help users find the data
- Dashboards also linked on OHA COVID-19 websites, in daily news releases
- Archived, robust quality assurance is essential

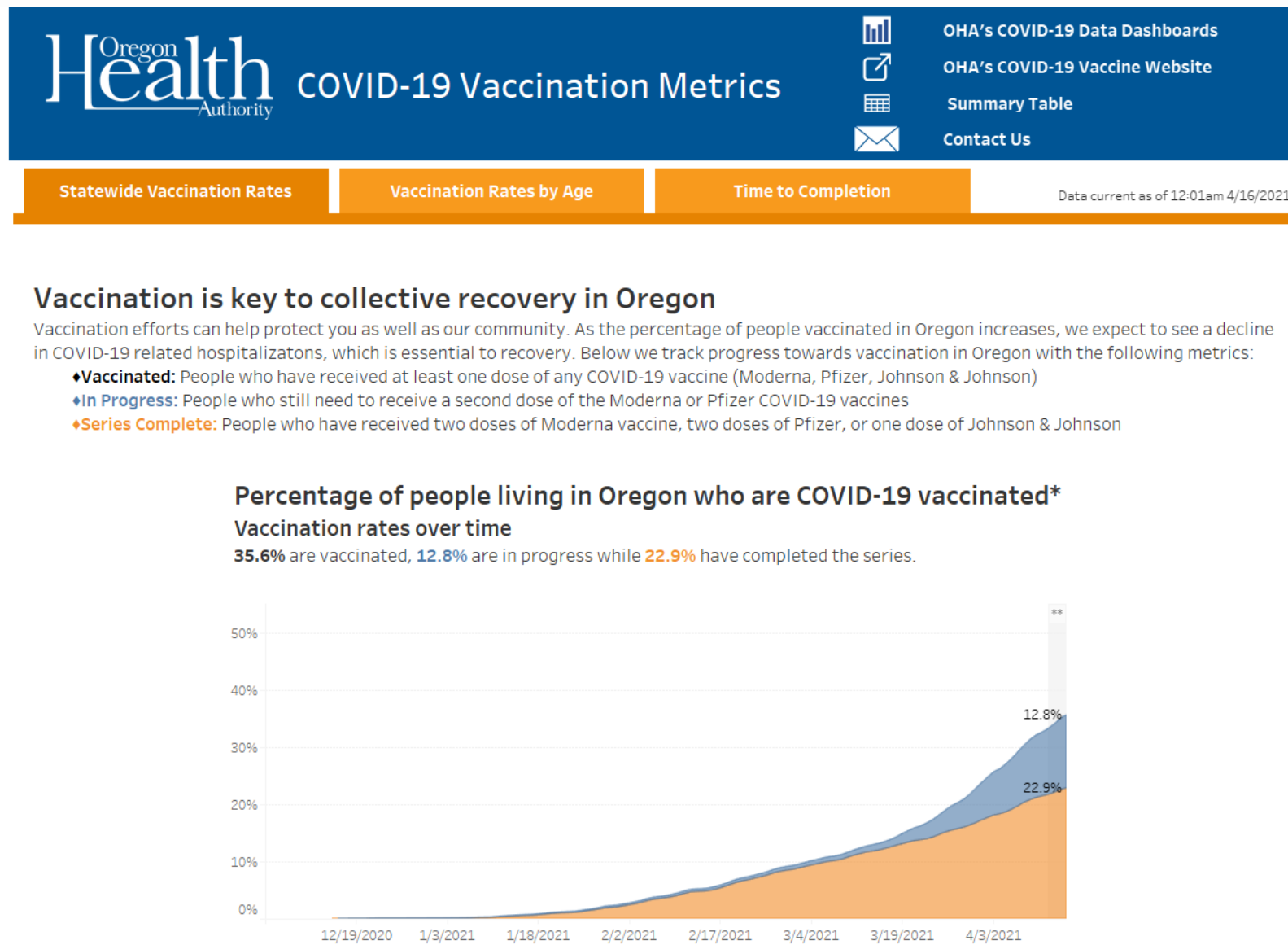
Vaccination is key to collective recovery in Oregon

Vaccination efforts can help protect you as well as our community. Progress in Oregon is measured using the following definitions:

- ♦**Vaccinated:** People who have received at least one dose of any COVID-19 vaccine (Moderna, Pfizer, Johnson & Johnson)
- ♦**In Progress:** People who still need to receive a second dose of the Moderna or Pfizer COVID-19 vaccines
- ♦**Series Complete:** People who have received two doses of Moderna vaccine, two doses of Pfizer, or one dose of Johnson & Johnson

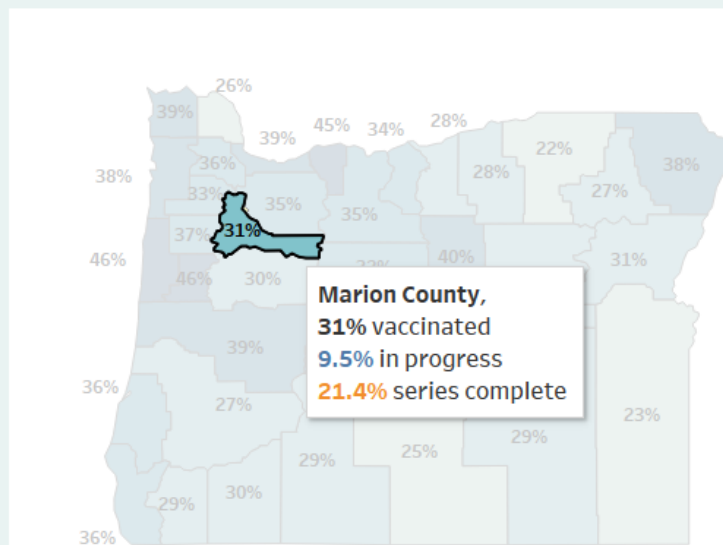
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Vaccination rates by county

Depending on the county, between 22% to 46% of people are vaccinated*

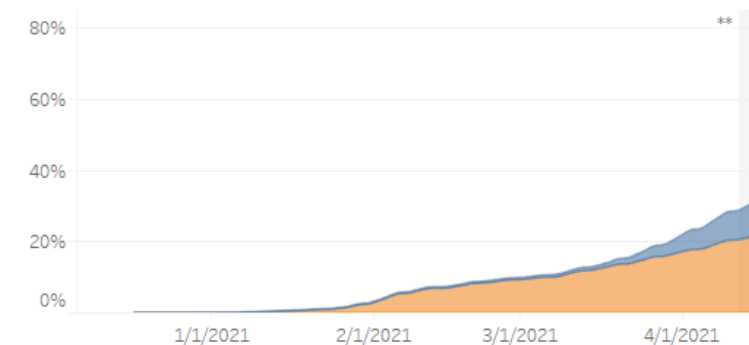

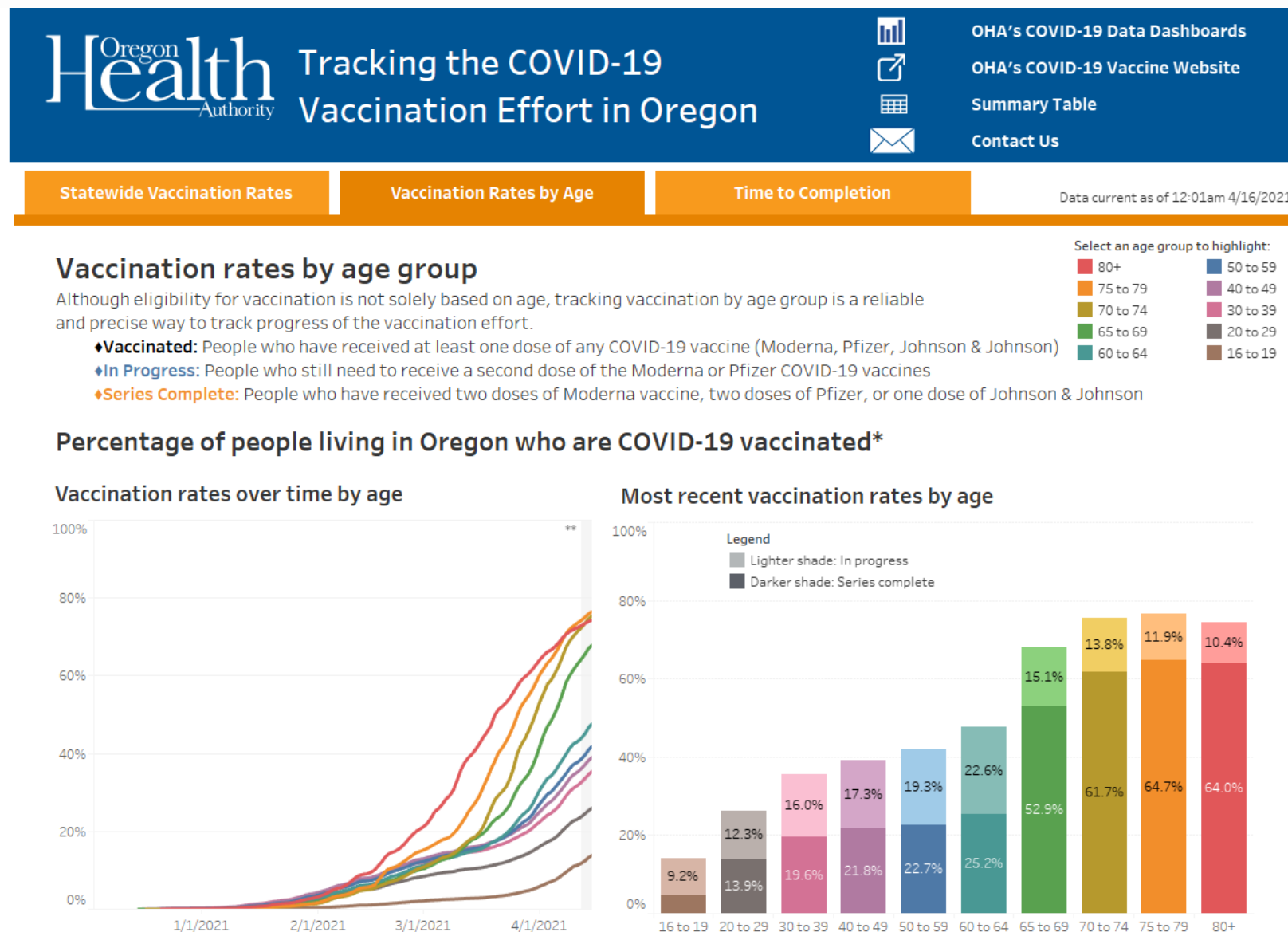

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Vaccination rates by county by age

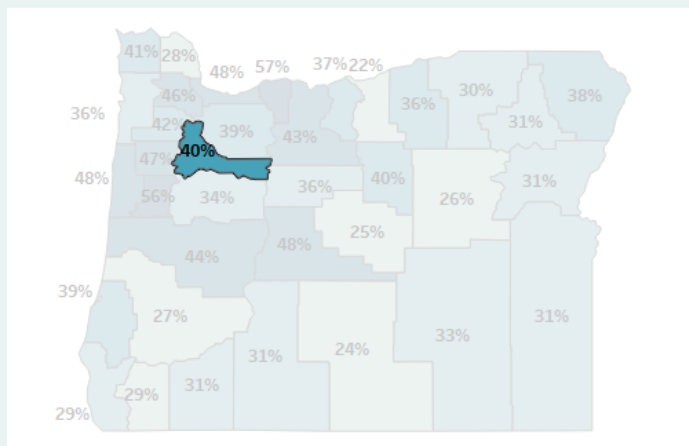

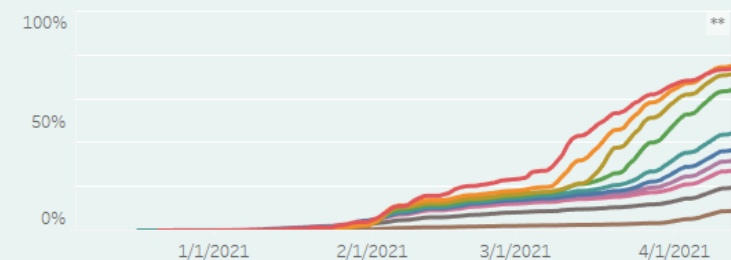

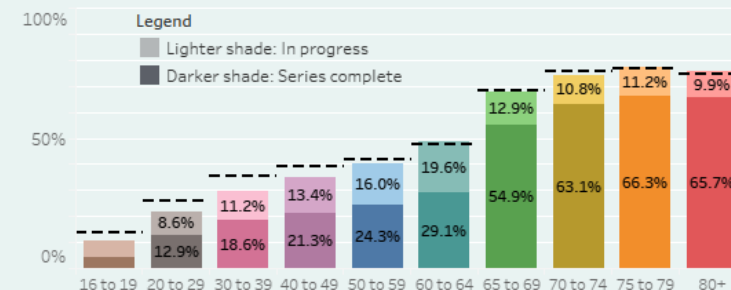

Vaccination rates over time by age

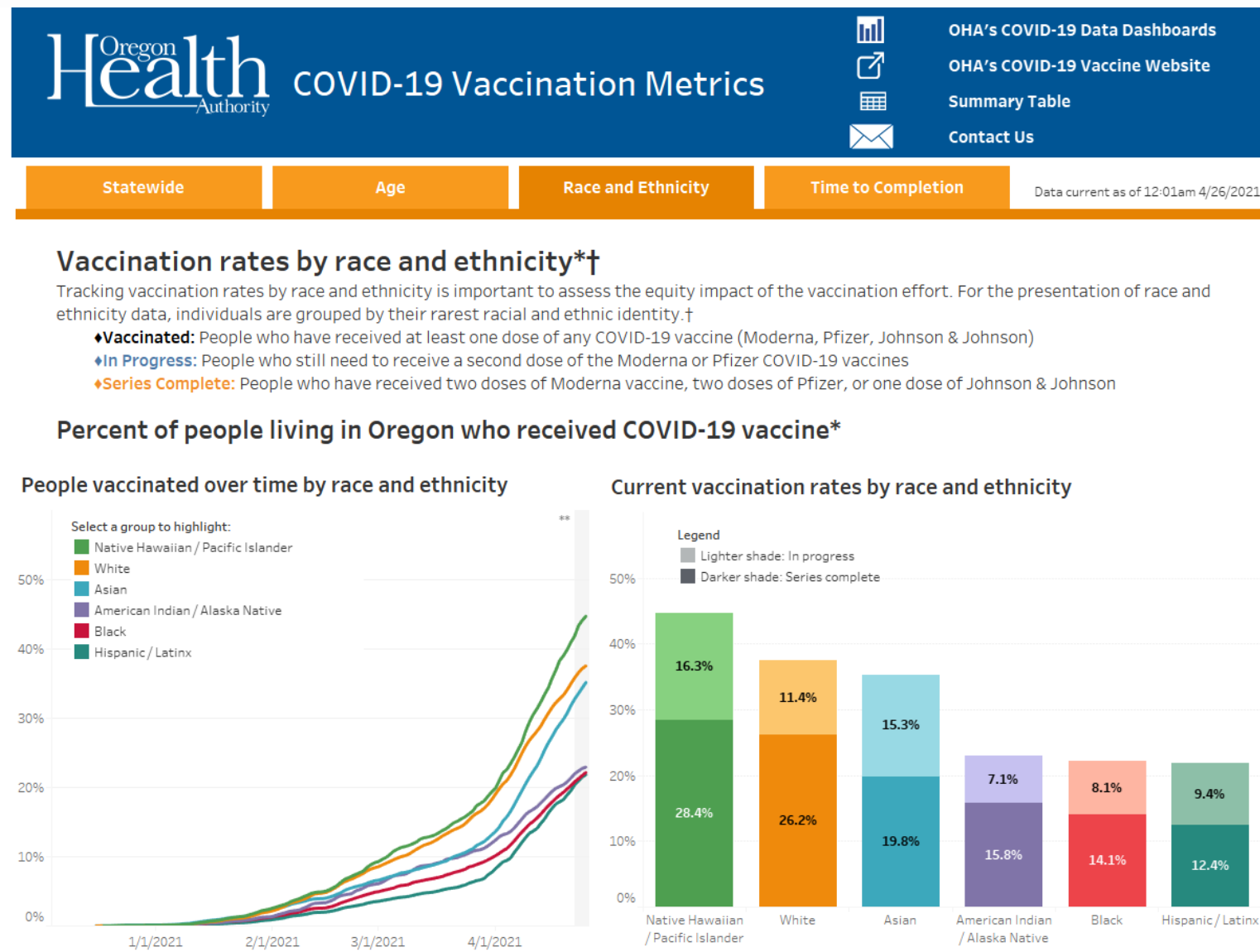


Most recent rates compared with statewide (---)



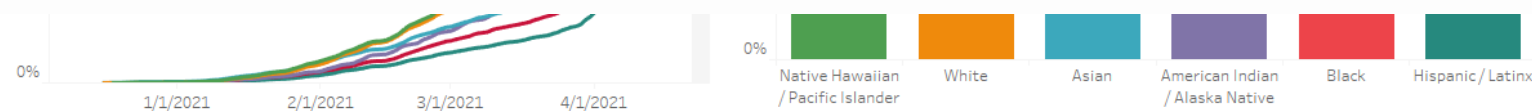
Start small, add more to the dashboard as you go

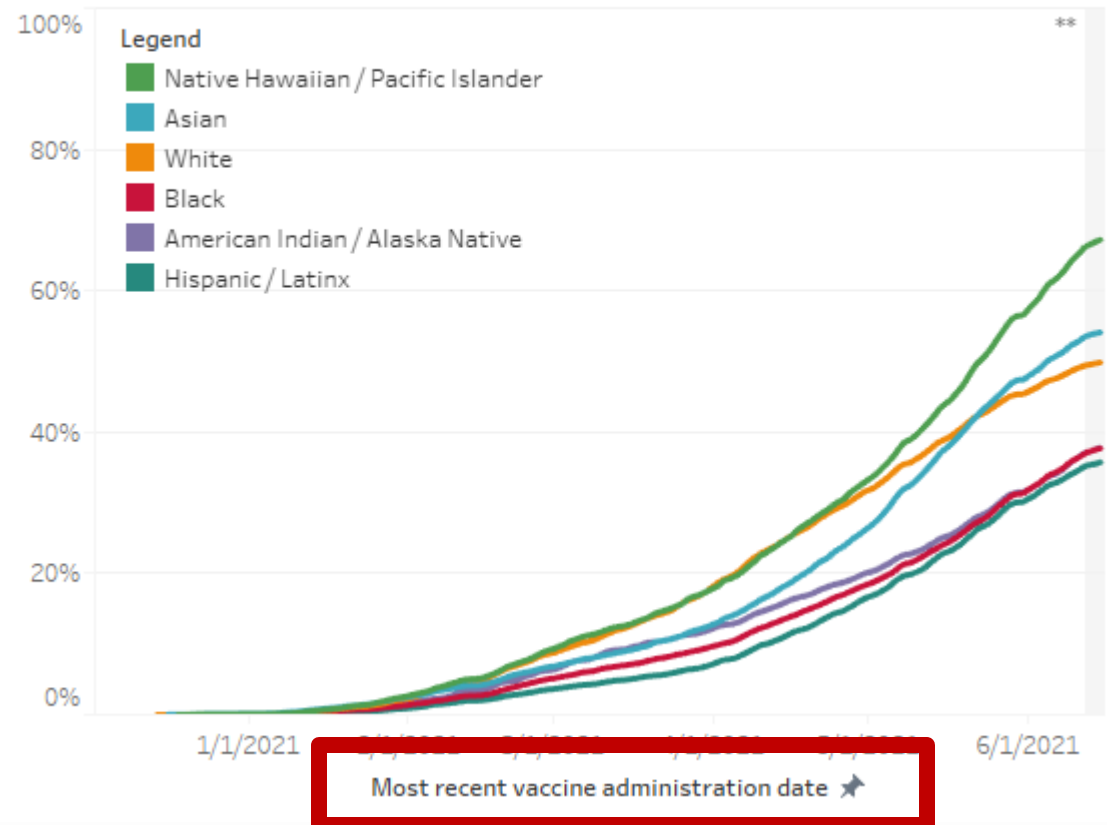

Respond to media inquiries with help from public information officers

- Weekly meeting with epidemiologists, data visualization informaticists, web team, public information officers, external communications
- Utilize daily news release to announce dashboard changes and anticipate media questions
- Answer questions about dashboards from media and public in timely manner
- Make additions to dashboards based on questions and suggestions
- Switch to plain language to align with external communications
- When in doubt, add more rather than take away anything

People vaccinated over time by race and ethnicity

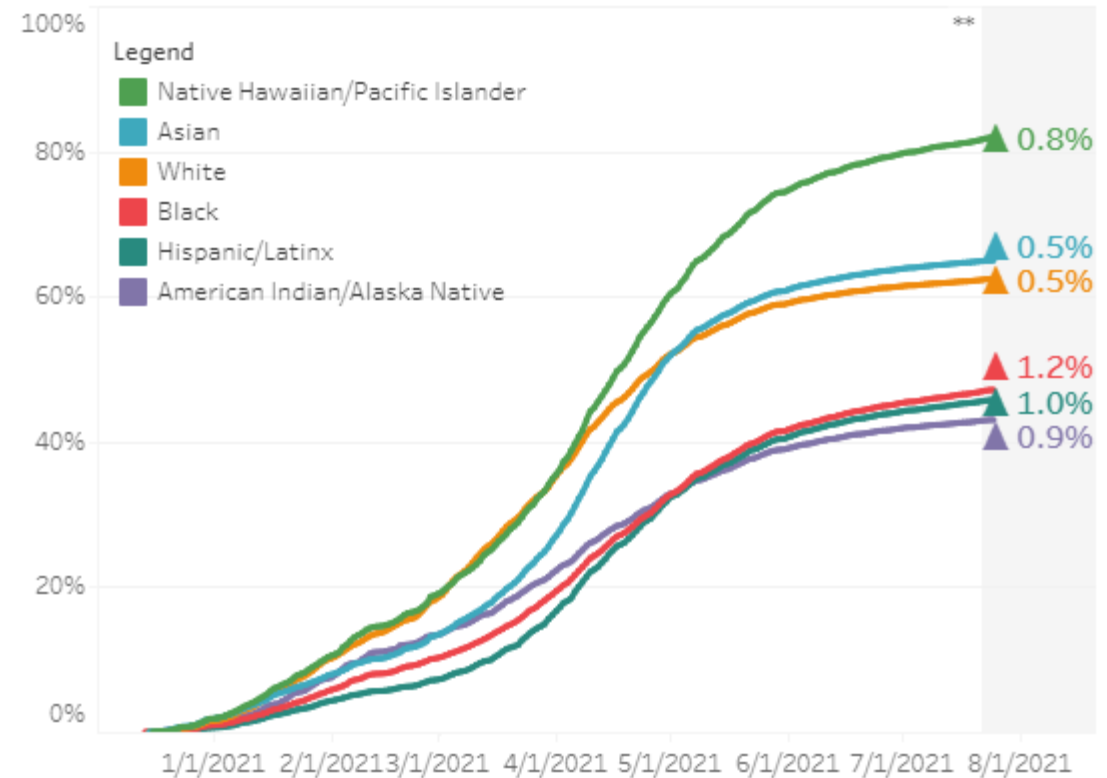


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People vaccinated over time by rarest race and ethnicity

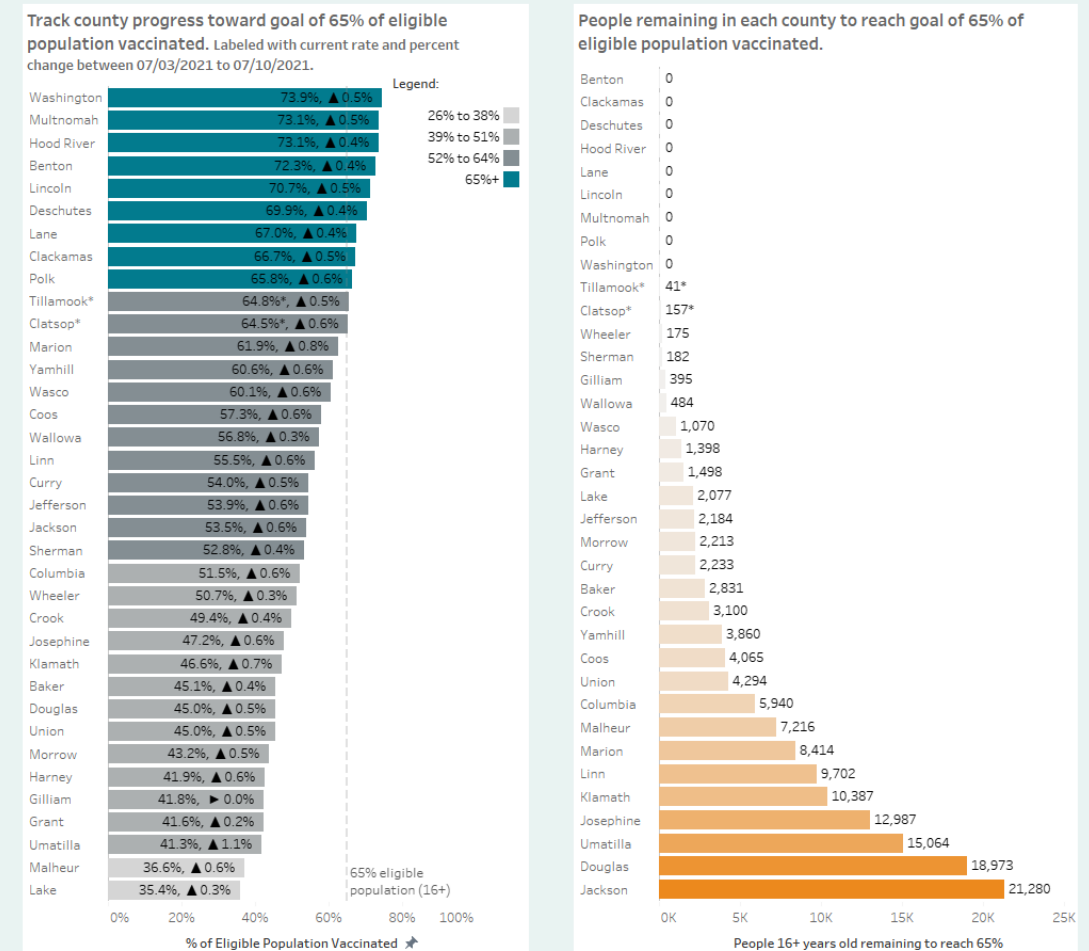

Align data visualizations with organization goals

- Governor announced a 65% vaccination goal
 - Became more important to easily know which counties had passed the goal and how many people remained
- Since this was first introduced, we've switched the vaccination goal to 80%
- We're, again, adding more to what was already visualized – retained county specific estimates on each dashboard



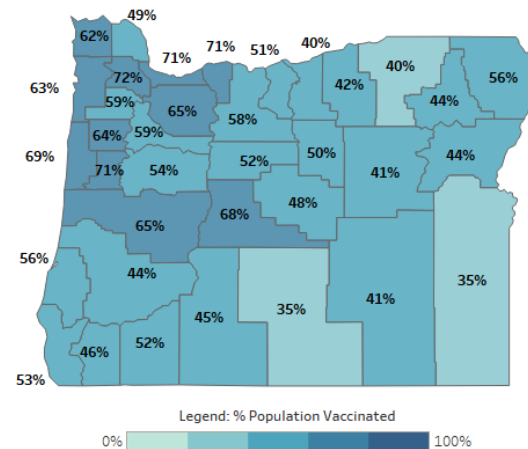

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County profile of vaccination rates

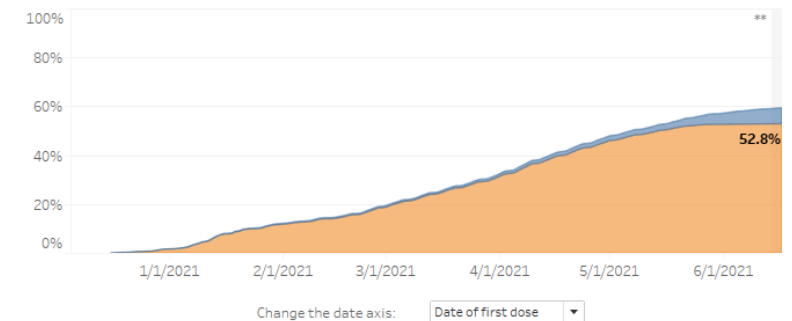

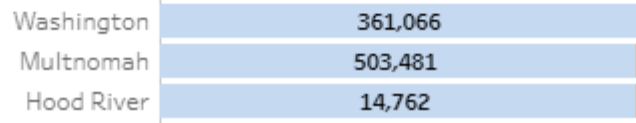

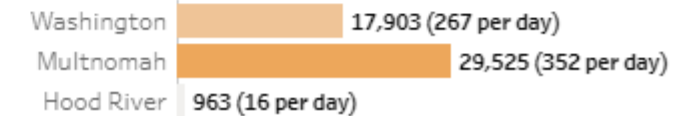

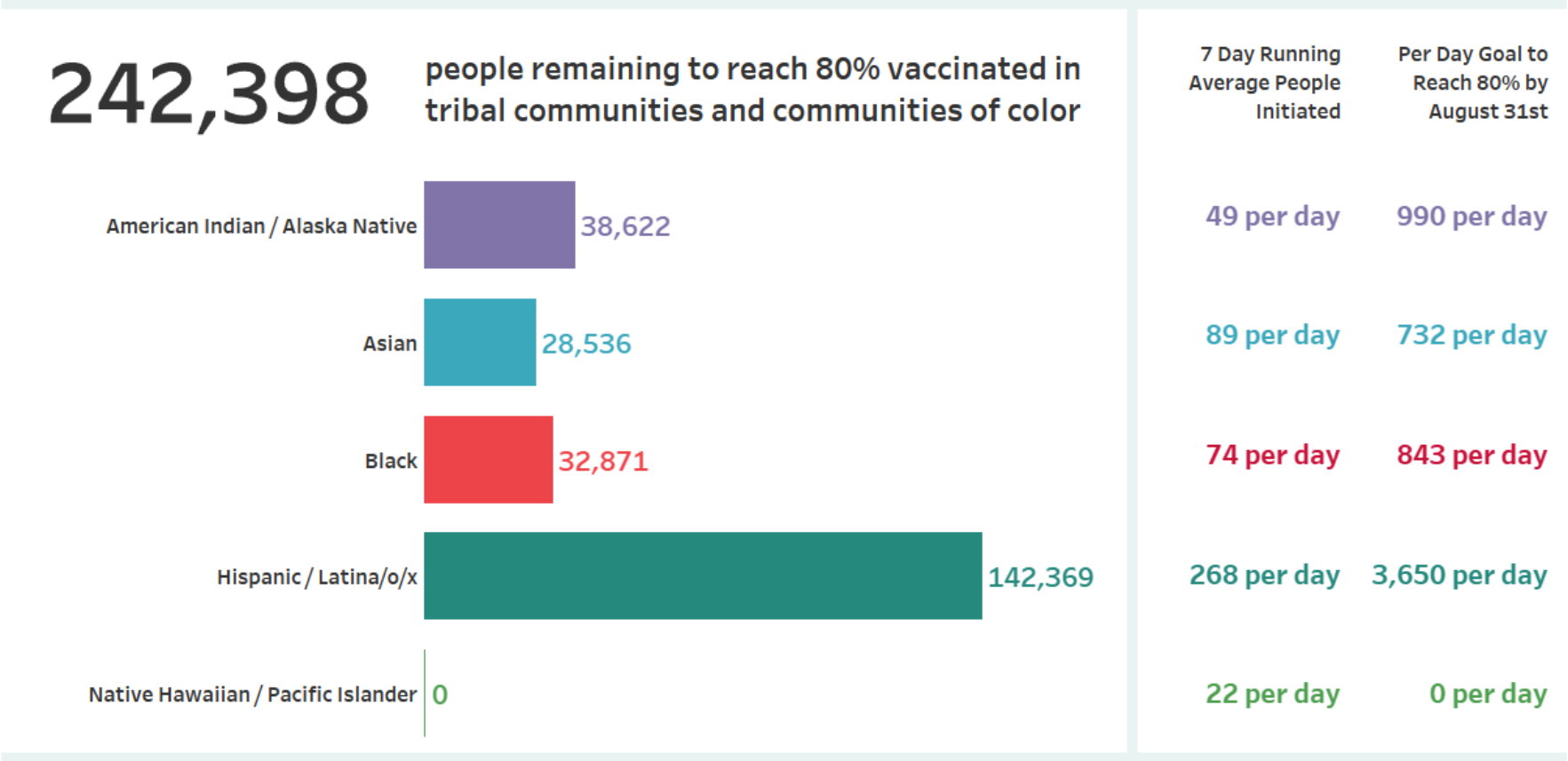

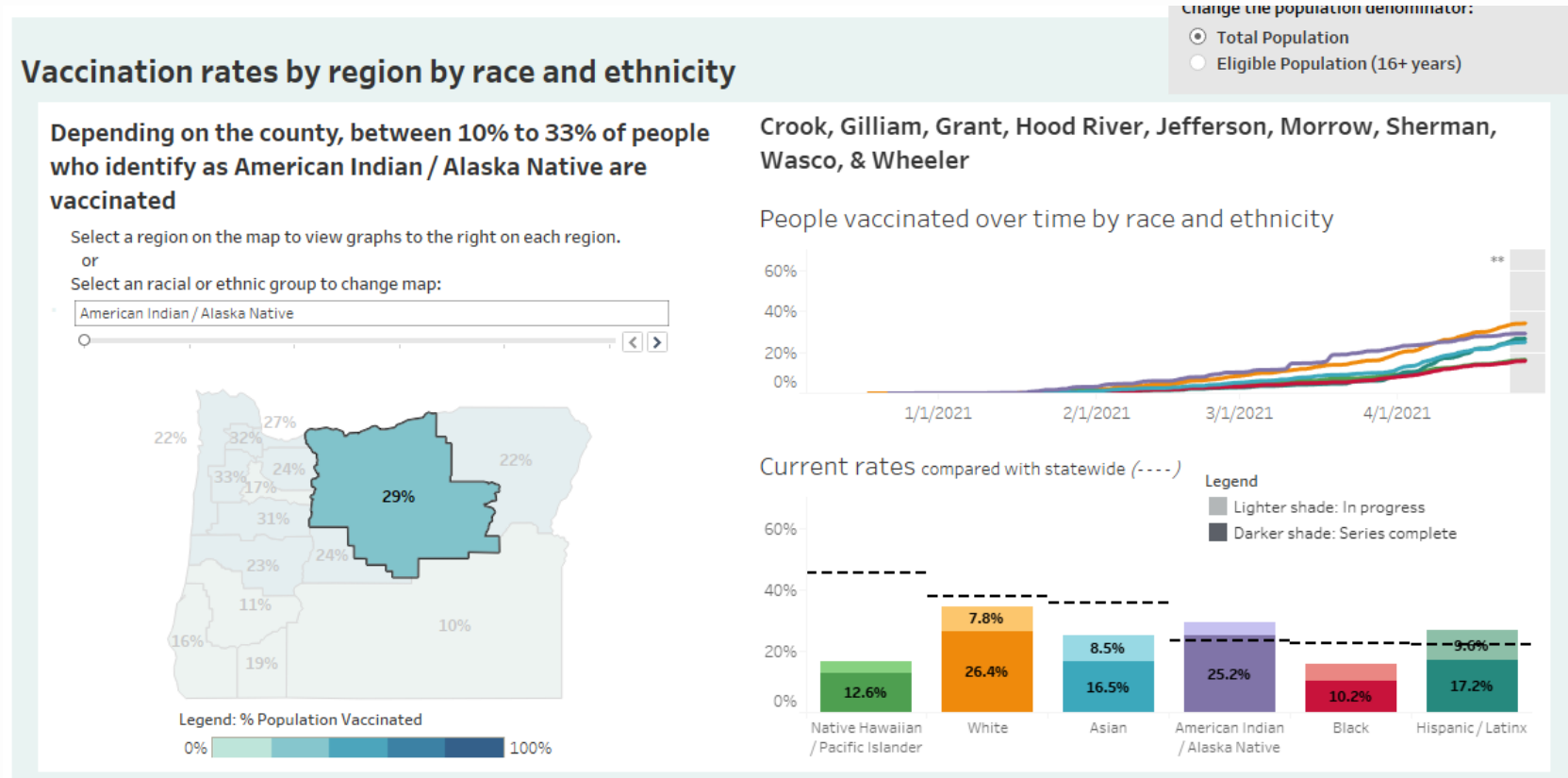

- However, it's much easier to see the big picture in a large column bar chart

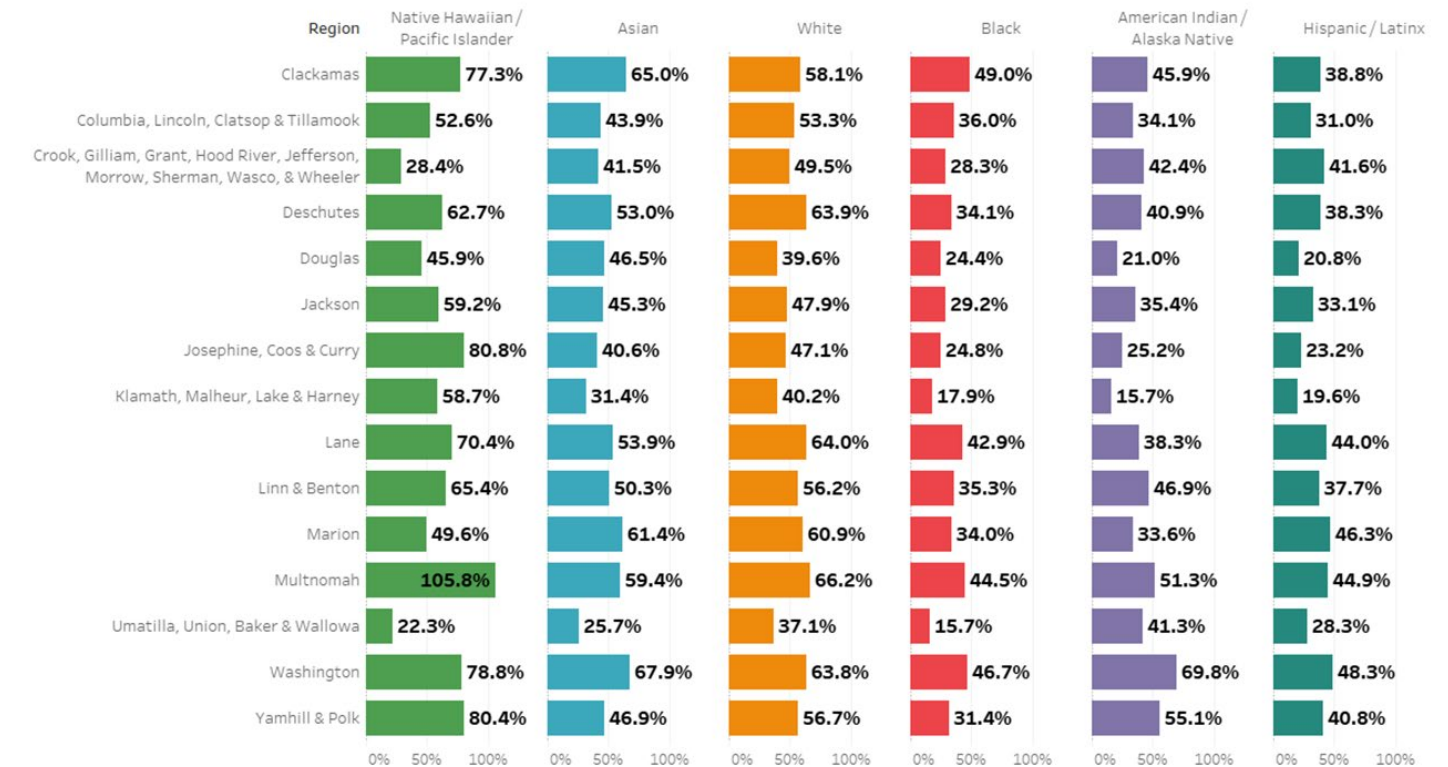

Percent of population vaccinated with at least one dose by region and rarest race and ethnicity

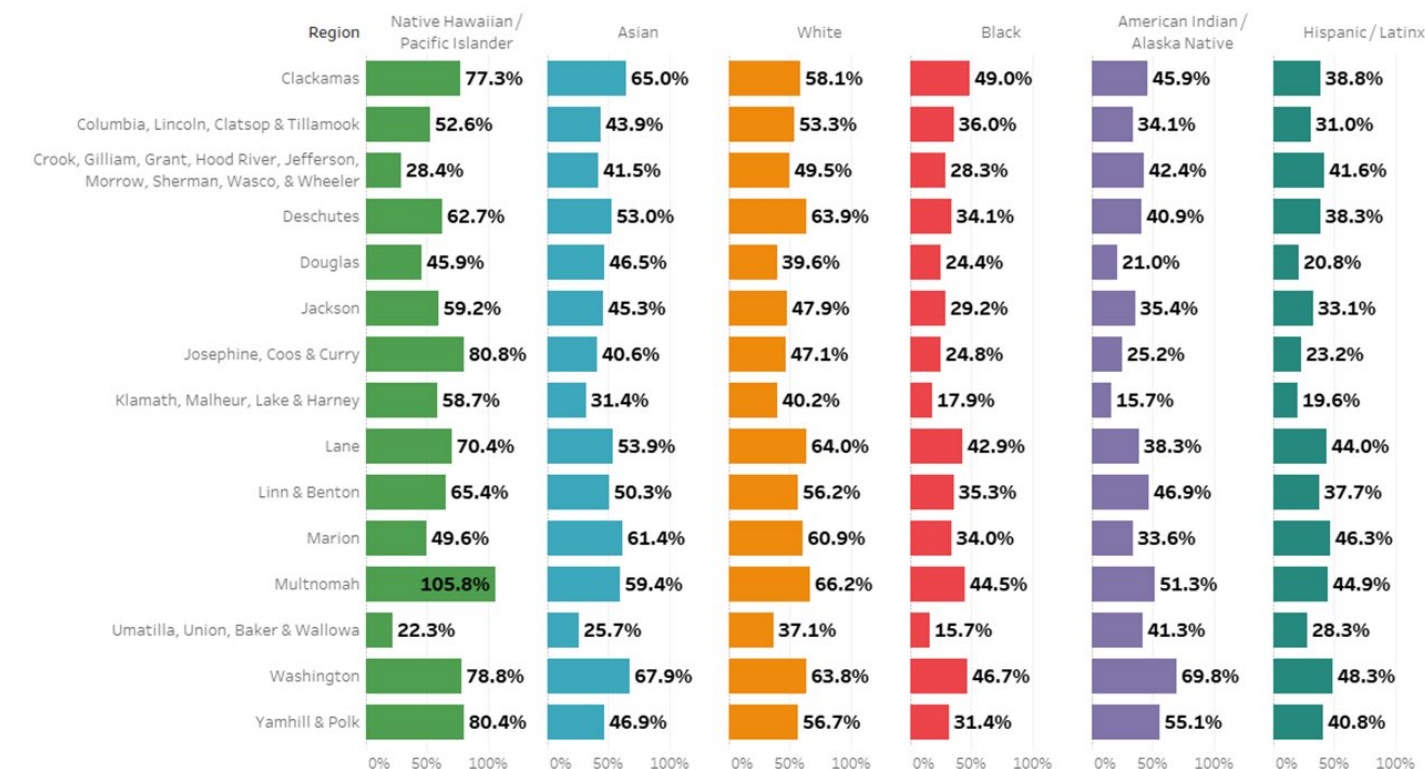


Lean into difficult topics, especially when it comes to equity

- Presented race and ethnicity data with a novel approach – where people are grouped by their **rarest racial and ethnic identity**.
- Important to publish regional estimates – not widely available – for local public health authorities (LPHAs)

Equity Impact - Data dashboards-To understand the differences in COVID-19's impact on racial groups in the US and to develop solutions, it's necessary to look beyond the topline numbers to disaggregated, granular, localized data that can offer a clearer, more empathetic picture of the challenges. When we know to look for the hidden stories in data, we are acknowledging that every data point is a person with unique needs and circumstances that we should bring into view.

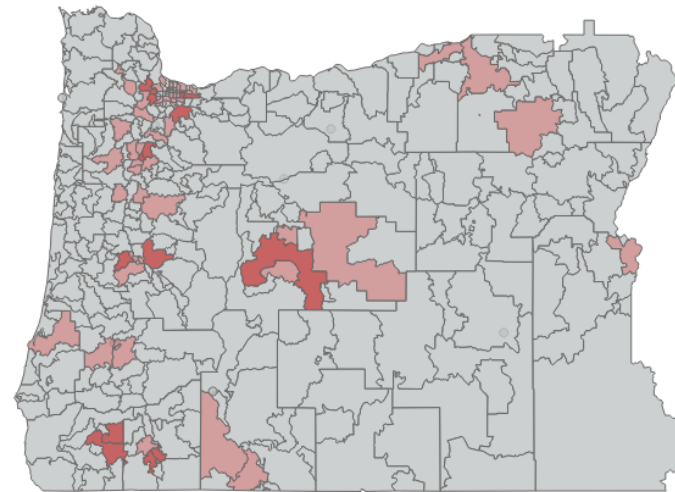
The map shows the number of people not vaccinated for COVID-19 by ZIP code of residence. ZIP code vaccinations are reported to align with ZIP Code Tabulation Area (ZCTA) population estimates by the American Community Survey which include the **total population of all ages** (eligible population estimates are not available). ZIP codes with less than 50 people in the population are grouped with nearby ZIP codes within the same county.

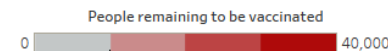

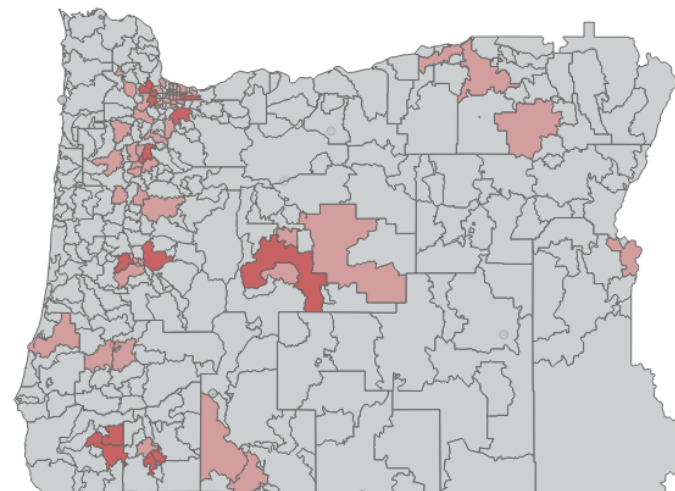
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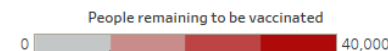
