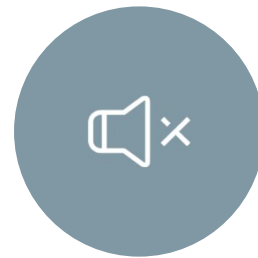

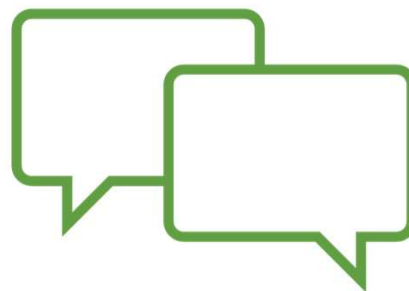

- Pilot tested PCC (Physician's Computer Company), in December!
- Conducting an in-depth test plan assessment to identify opportunities to streamline and increase value and impact
- Public Health Data Systems Task Force 2022 recommended "ONC update the (f)(1) criteria to recognize the HIMSS-AIRA-IIP test method as the standard test method used for certification"
  - Exciting news and raises many questions!



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## IIP Updates - Collaborative

- **Pre-submission data validation** work is underway
- Conducting discovery on **code set** challenges and best practices to provide resources to improve the speed and consistency in the implementation of new code set values
- IIP hosted a webinar (available in the AIRA Repository) in December announcing its new priorities including
  - Immunization data from pharmacies,
  - Legal baby names
  - Submission and query triggers
- AIRA/IIP will be at HIMSS23 in April in Chicago – let us know if you will be too!



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## Measurement & Improvement: Data at Rest (DAR)



DAR measures the **Completeness, Timeliness, and Validity** of the data residing in an IIS database, regardless of how it arrived there



Formal approval of the measures and tests to move DAR into the second M&I stage of Assessment

- Participating IIS' alignment will be formally measured

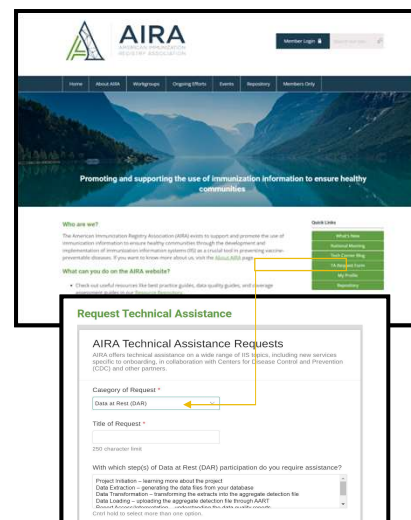

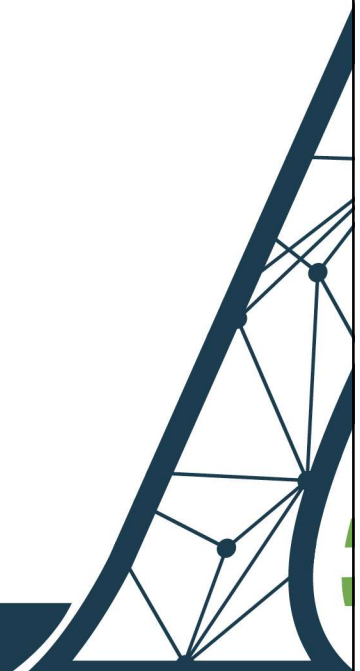

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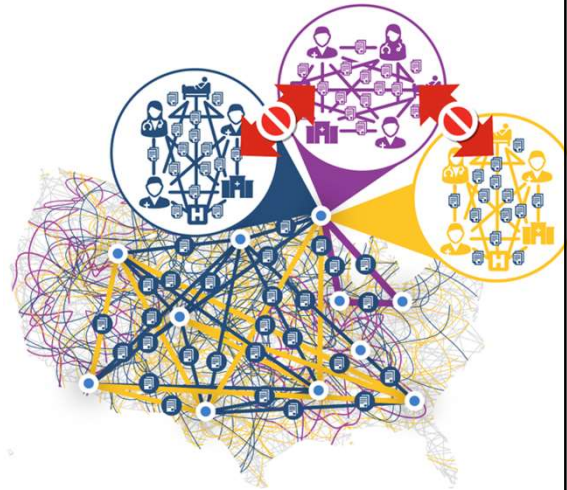
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## Existing networks are great...but not enough

While there has been growth in nationwide networks, there is much unfinished business

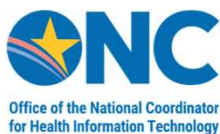

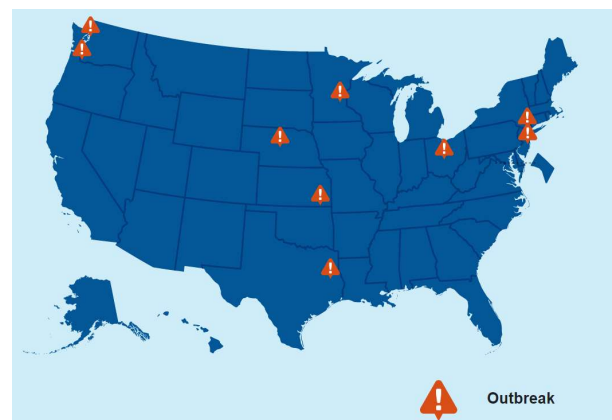

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## ASTHO Continues to Refine the Policy Statement

- Working to review and revise the immunization policy statement
- The policy statement is a listing of guiding principals
  - Evidence based
  - Vaccine finance
  - Vaccine access and delivery
  - Vaccine safety and effectiveness
  - IIS
  - Vaccine during a pandemic
- This statement is used when ASTHO is advocating for policies on state/territory's behalf

#### ASTHO Policy Statement Development Process

Approved by the Assembly of Members on January 25, 2018

**Background**  
This policy describes the process by which ASTHO will develop official policy statements.

**Rationale for ASTHO Policy Statements**

- Purpose.** The purpose of ASTHO Policy Statements is to:
  - document and provide a written record of ASTHO's official position on public health issues of importance to state and territorial health officials and/or their agencies;
  - provide the public, policymakers, media, healthcare providers, and the public health enterprise with an informed position on a public health issue;
  - serve as a resource, including sharing evidence and data to support a particular policy, on an issue of importance to state/territorial health agencies;
  - guide advocacy efforts, including the drafting of op-eds, letters to the editor, testimony to Congress and the Administration, and requests for comments by national and state organizations.
- Development.** ASTHO will develop new Policy Statements when:
  - there is a public health issue that would benefit from a policy position from State/Territorial Health leaders to ensure the state/territory voice is heard;
  - there is an existing policy statement that needs to be updated due to an emerging health threat, new science, advances in practice or a changed systems environment making the existing policy obsolete or out of date.
- Decision to Develop a Policy Statement.** Individual ASTHO Members, ASTHO Committees, the ASTHO Board, or the ASTHO Assembly of Members may propose the development of an ASTHO Policy Statement. Staff suggestions can be made through any of these channels.

Proposals to develop an ASTHO Policy Statement must contain a discussion of the issue, suggestions on potential substantive content, and a recommendation for the ASTHO Policy Committee that should be charged with Policy Statement development.

Following a confidential vote of all members whereby at a minimum 35 of the ASTHO members must approve, the proposal will be adopted.

Each year flu season in the United States causes millions of cases and thousands of hospitalizations. In recent months, flu circulating until as late as possible in the season and nature of the measures.

Vaccination is one of public health's most powerful and cost-effective tools to prevent disease, disability, and death among children and adults. All states and territories require children to be vaccinated against certain diseases (e.g., measles) to enroll in school. These vaccination requirements always include a medical exemption and at least 44 states and Washington, D.C. also grant a religious or personal belief exemption.

Beyond childhood vaccinations, some states require immunizations for healthcare workers and private employers may require vaccinations as a condition of employment. With the 2021-2022 influenza season coinciding with the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, public health efforts to ensure vaccination for both COVID-19 and flu are important to prevent severe illness from overwhelming the healthcare system. Each year millions of Americans receive a flu vaccine. During the 2020-2021 flu season 58.6% of children between six months and 17 years old and 50.2% of adults received the flu vaccine.

While effectiveness varies, recent studies show vaccination reduces the risk of flu by 40-60%. Getting an annual flu vaccine not only reduces the risk of illness and death, but also lowers the risk of hospitalization and time away from school or work. For these and a variety of other public health-related reasons, CDC recommends an annual flu vaccination for everyone six

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## Reducing Vaccine Disparities

ASTHO, in partnership with the [National Community Action Partnership](#) (NCAP), developed a program to reduce disparities in vaccination rates to advance health equity and reduce the burden of vaccine preventable disease among adults

Last year, ASTHO developed an advisory committee of professional organizations  
And

Selected 5 pilot programs to focus on using evidence-based strategies to increase immunization rates and advance equity in their community

This year, ASTHO plans to work with the same sites to continue to implement strategies to assist and support vaccine equity in these five communities, with a particular focus on reaching people living with mental and/or physical disabilities



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## IDEAS Program

The ONC IDEAS program aims to provide technical assistance and capacity building support to cross-sector state teams to **build and expand partnerships between** state, regional, or local health information exchanges (**HIEs**) and state/territory immunization information systems (**IISs**).



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## COVID-19 IMMUNIZATION DATA EXCHANGE, ADVANCEMENT & SHARING PROGRAM

- With support from ONC, the Association of State & Territorial Health Officials (ASTHO) is hosting the **IDEAS Learning Community**
- The learning community convenes state health agency leaders, their staff, and HIE partners to advance and achieve sustainable change in **immunization information system & HIE partnership and data sharing**
- State grantees receive **financial awards** and **technical assistance** to advance data sharing. The learning community will also support **peer-to-peer learning** and **dissemination of promising practices**

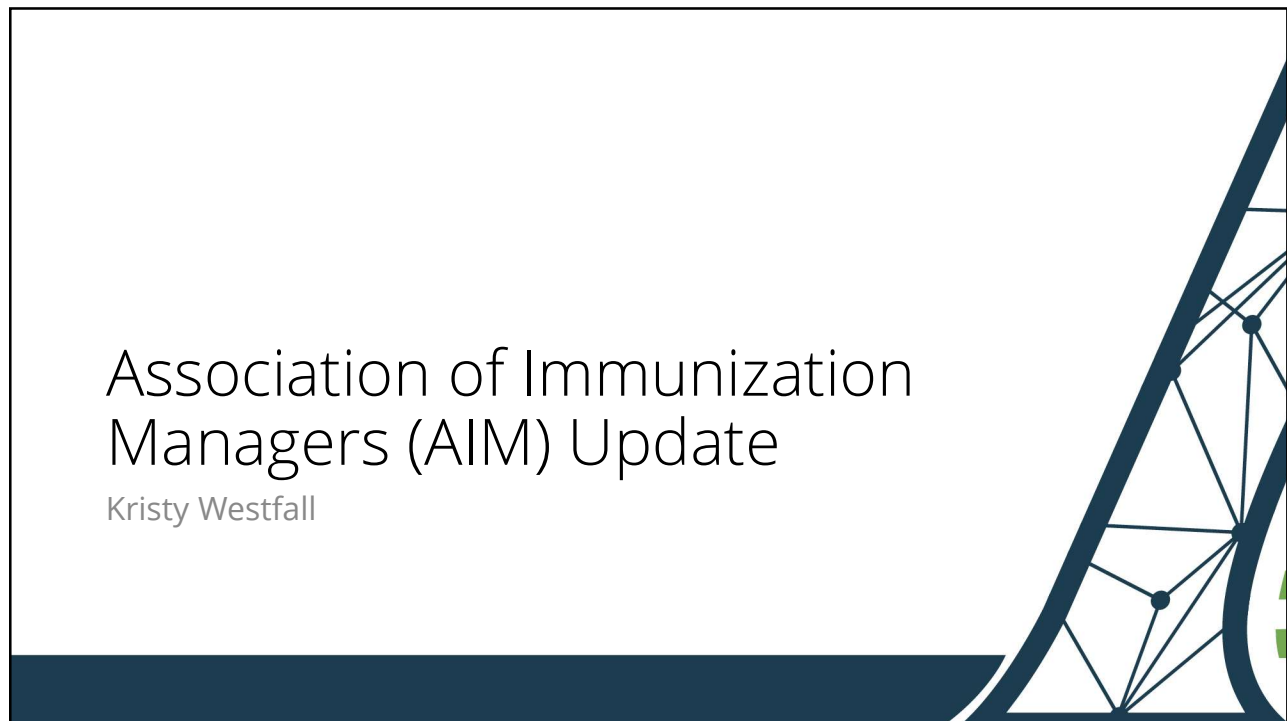

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# Preparing for the 2023 Legislative Session

## A look back:

- Number of vaccine-related bills introduced
  - 2021: 492
  - 2022: 594
  - 2023 To date: 295
- At least 24 states passed laws limiting COVID vaccination requirements or verification
- Strong trend to limit state public health authority

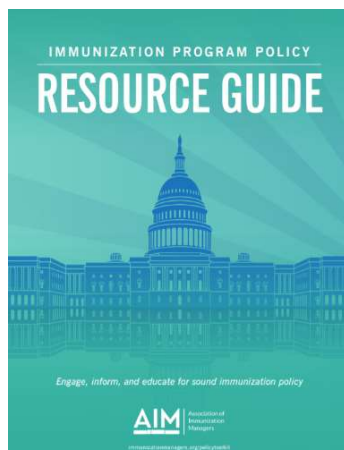
## Tips shared with Program Managers on how to prepare:

- Anticipate substantial interest in vaccine-related legislation, especially mandates, exemptions, 'anti-discrimination due to vaccine status', vaccine safety, IIS Opt-In, and minor consent.
- Develop agency policy and messaging in advance on anticipated issues, if possible, and in accordance with your state process. Share with stakeholders as appropriate.

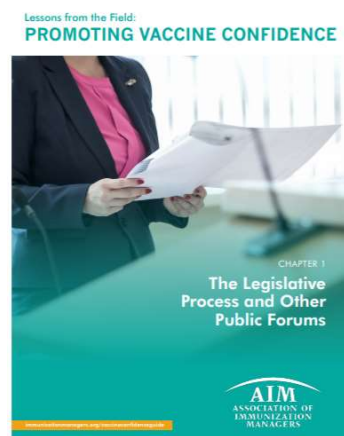

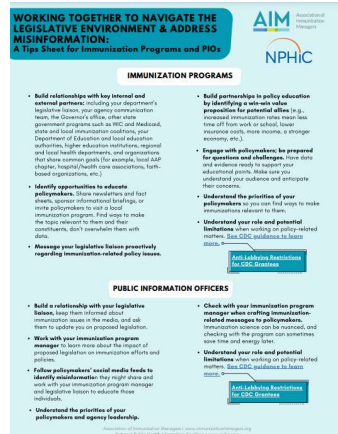

## Tip Sheet: Working Together to Navigate the Legislative Environment & Address Misinformation



### Program Manager Tips

- Create a dedicated position/role for immunization communications within your public affairs team if possible, such as a Vaccine Information Officer
- Public information officers (PIOs) cannot dispel myths and rumors and create key information if they aren't aware of what's going on. Create an internal topic-specific (i.e. COVID-19, measles) email group for the full immunization and communications teams, such as a daily email brief. Contact tracing and nursing teams can share key information and insights with PIOs and others on the team.
- CC PIOs on emails and establish other routes of communication to determine how much PIOs would like to be copied on. Don't be afraid to include them on email!
- Embed PIOs in immunization program meetings so they can have a comprehensive understanding of key vaccination information in addition to weekly check-in meetings.
- PIOs don't want to be the last to know. Sending "FYI" emails or calls can help them anticipate/prep for upcoming communication and saves them time when having to figure out info when asked questions.

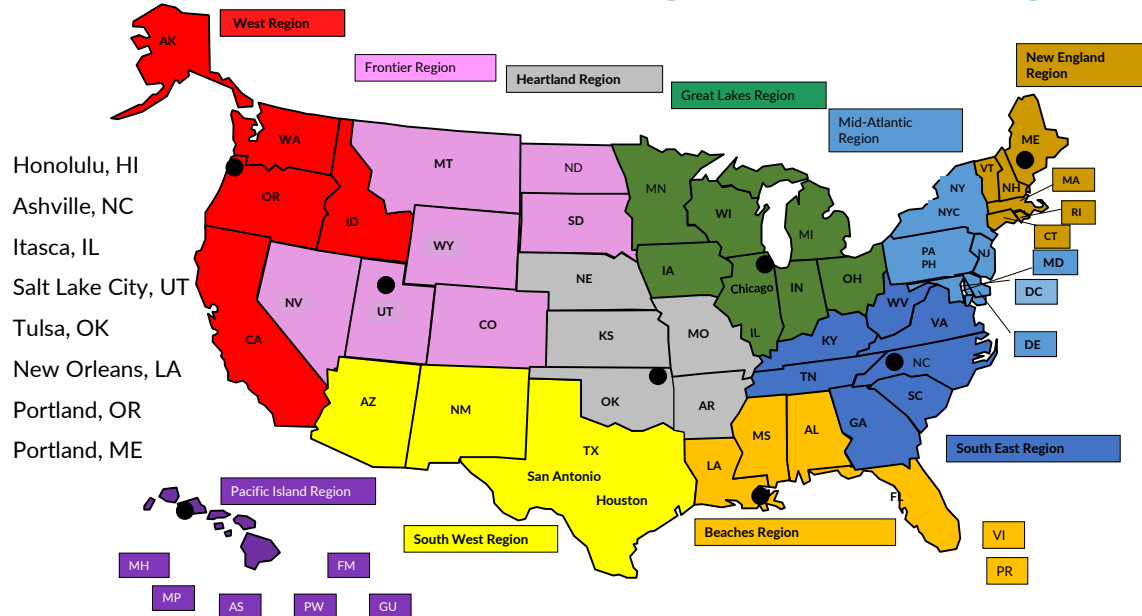

AIM, along with the National Academy for State Health Policy and Academy Health are hosting regional meetings of a newly-formed **Vaccine Access Cooperative (VAC)**, focused on **improving COVID-19 and routine vaccination rates among children**.

VAC meetings will bring together leaders from state departments of health, immunization programs, and Medicaid programs, as well as the American Academy of Pediatrics, the American Academy of Family Physicians, pharmacy associations, and other key immunization partners to develop strategies to break down barriers to the successful vaccination of children.

Meetings will be held in 8 cities across the U.S. with funding provided through a grant from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

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## 2022 AIM Annual Survey Results & Webinar

- The AIM Annual Survey assess changes in immunization programs over time. Topics include infrastructure, COVID-19, funding, IIS, vaccine confidence and more.
- This year, the Annual Survey had an **83% response rate**.
