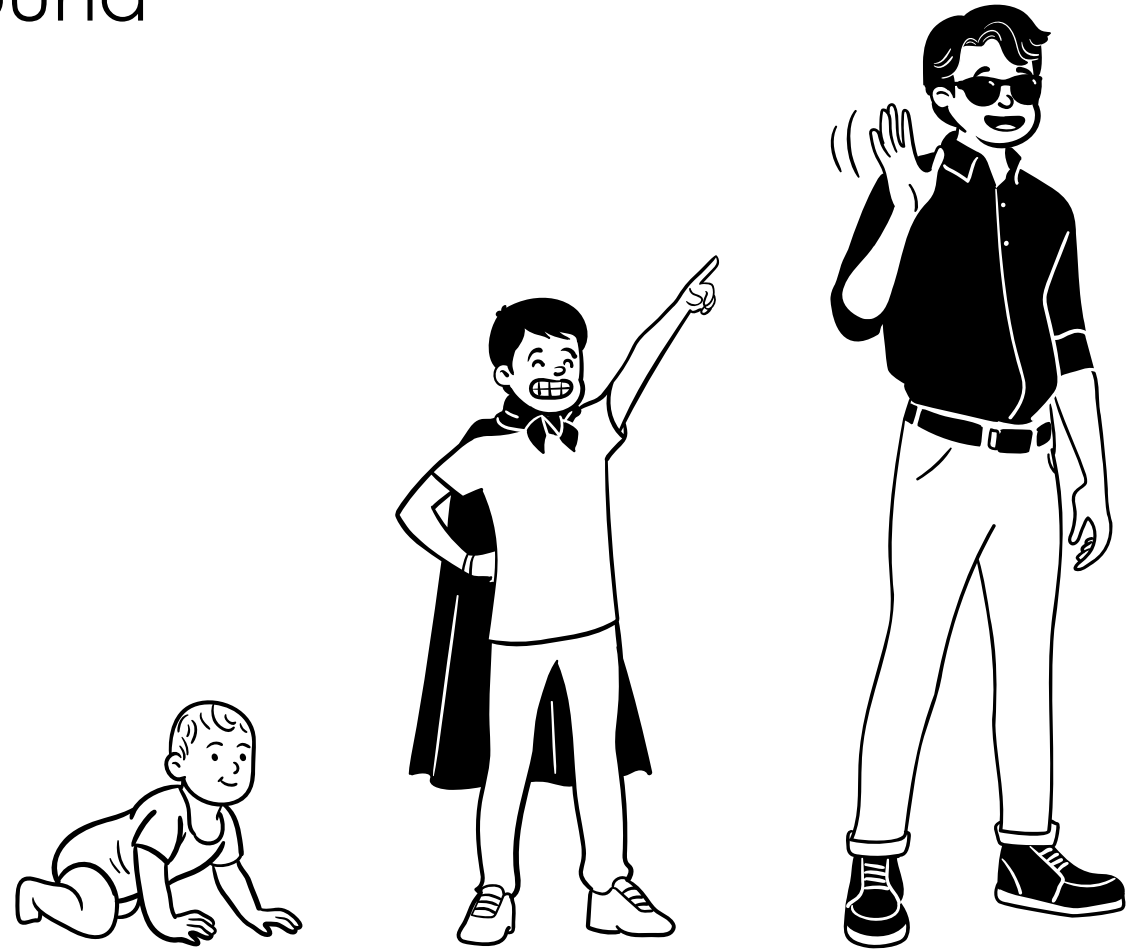

Rapid growth during the pandemic created an environment in need of a forum for cross collaboration and standardization.

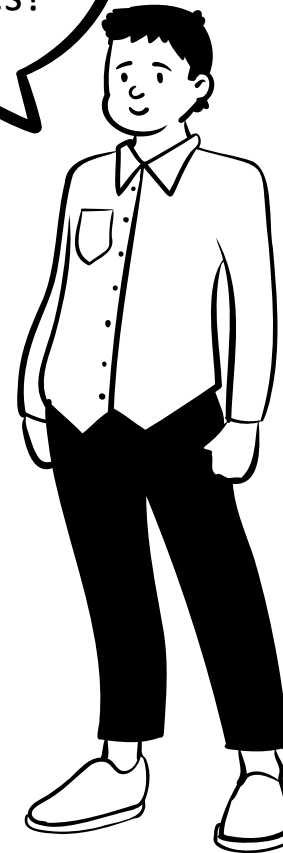
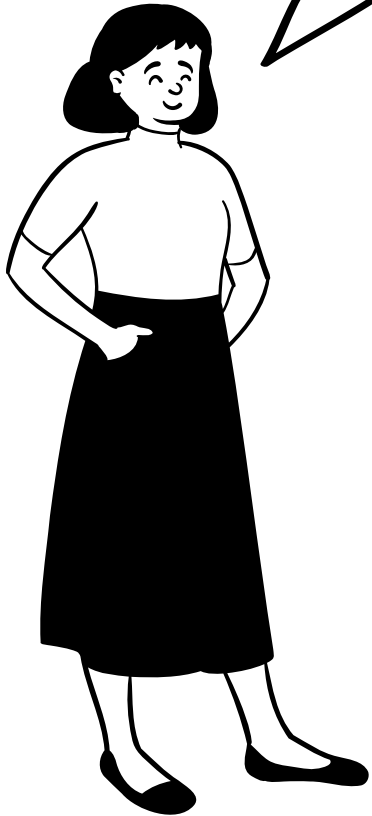

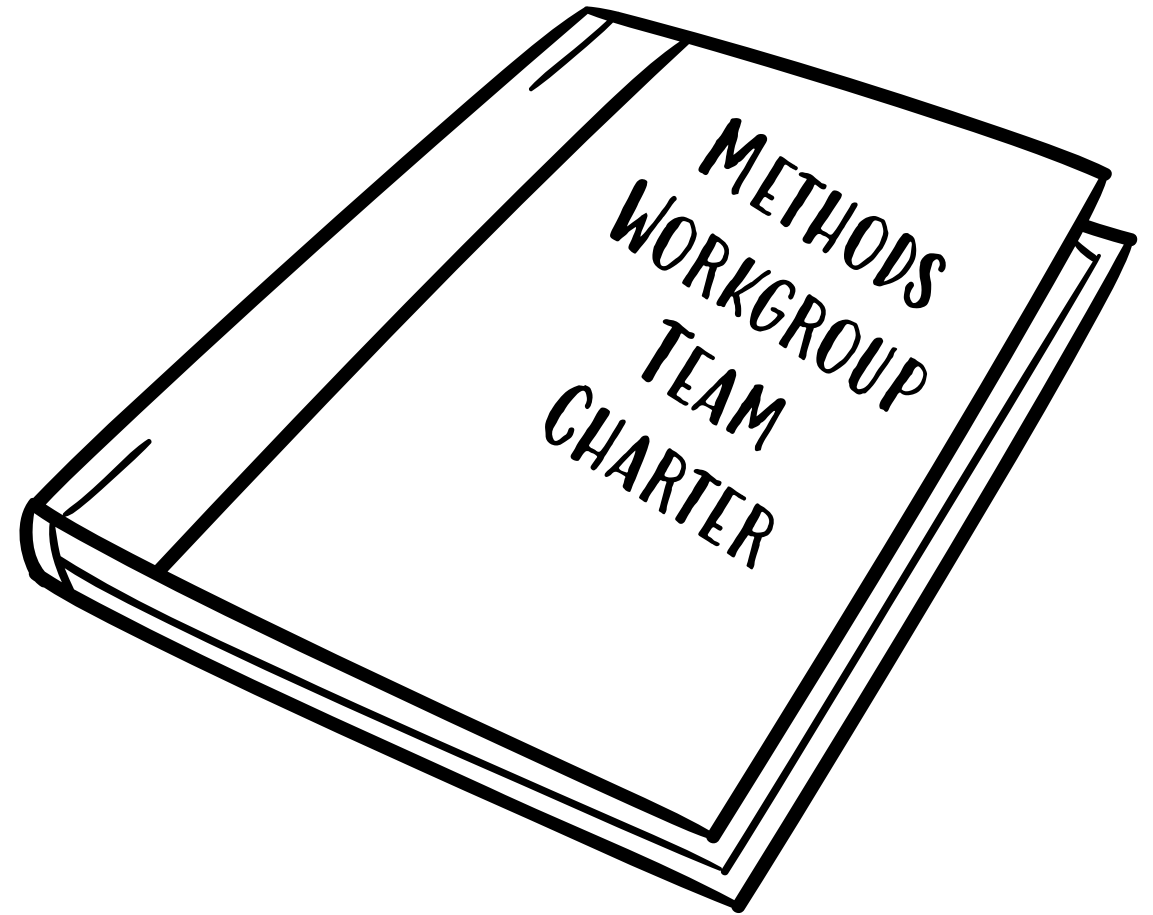


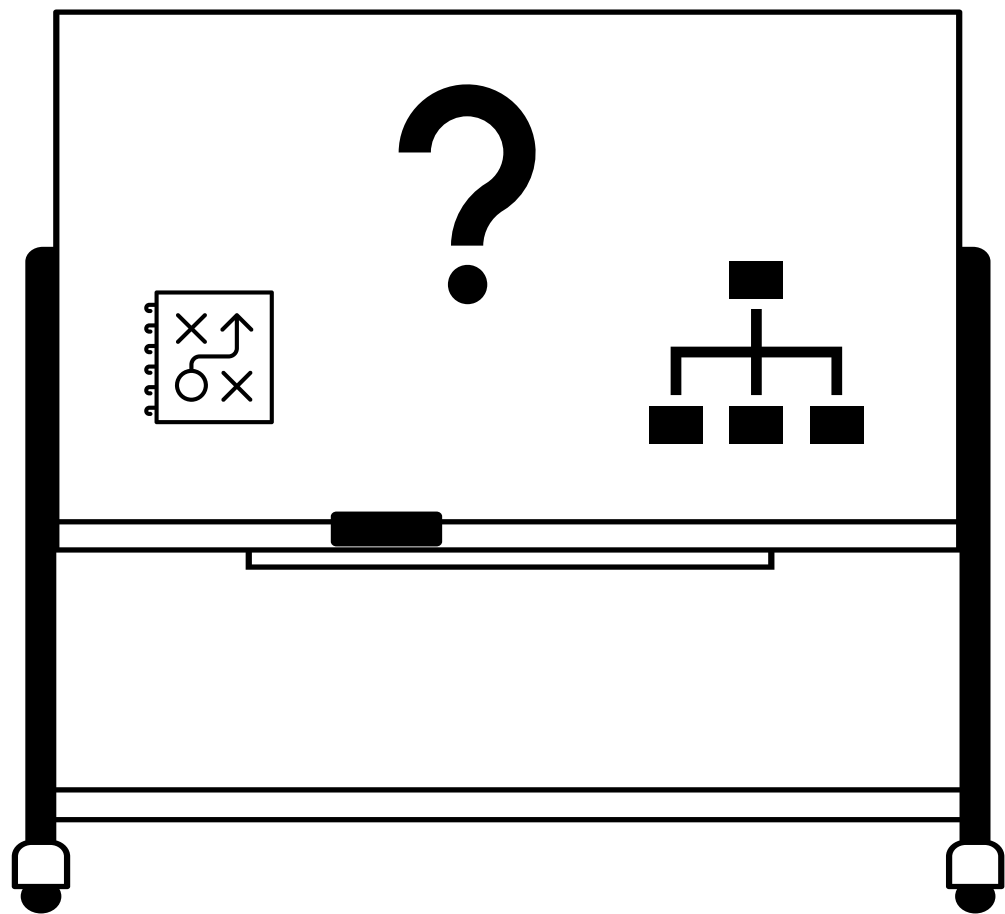


METHODS WORKGROUP

This living document defined our role as a group and outlined our purpose, scope, motivation, and membership details.

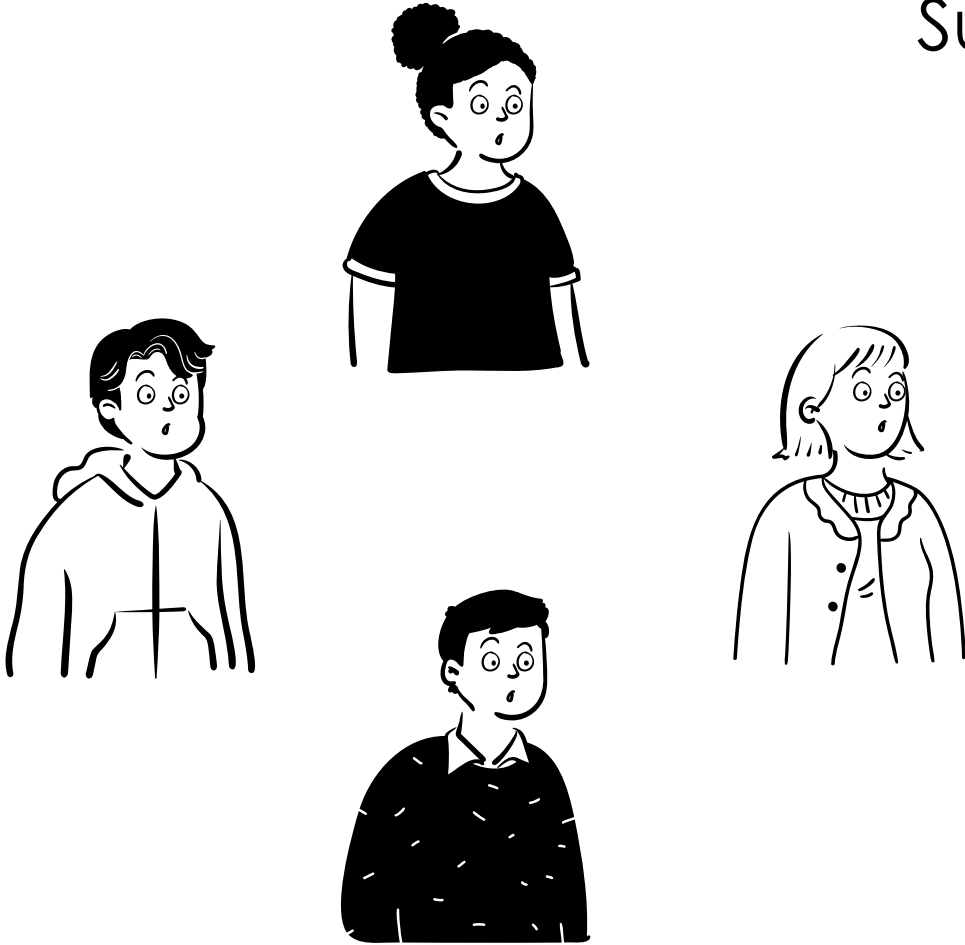




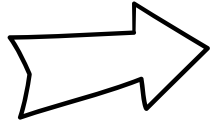
Workgroup Structure... a journey.



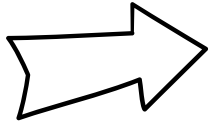

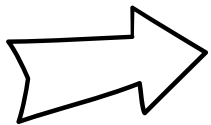

Created a Data Management Plan, Best Practices Guide, and Resource Finalization Guide.

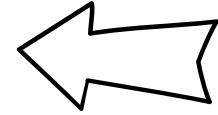


Establishment of a space in GitHub to store standardized and commonly used code.

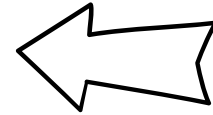




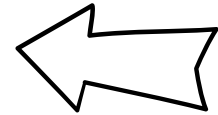

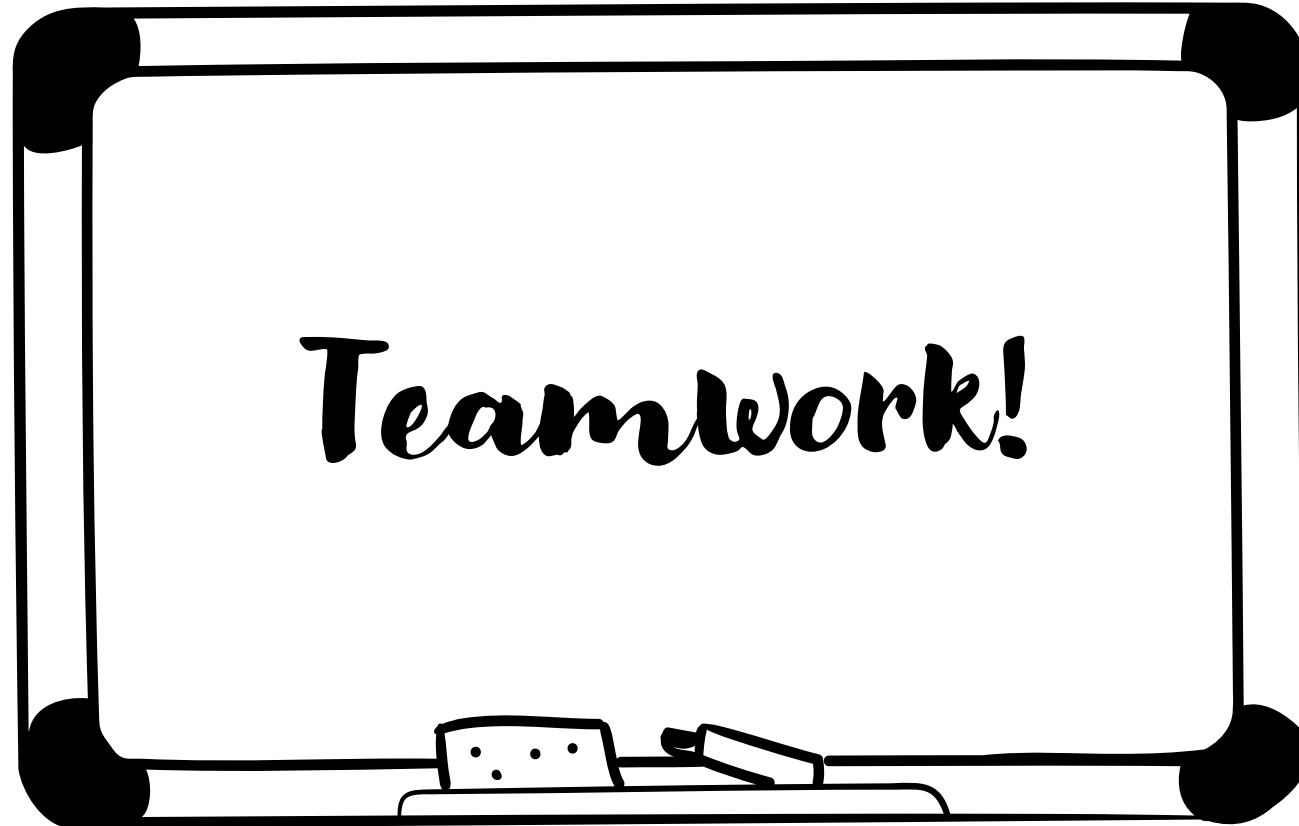
Progress has been slow.
