- Provide direct access to IIS records
- Allows people to easily access IIS record for providing immunization records for school/childcare, employment, travel, etc.
- Empower individuals with information to make decisions
- Reduce barriers to immunization records
- Decreased record requests from public
- Increased data quality





- Receiving hundreds of record requests a day.
- Docket rolled out in September 2021.
- Validation: Matching criteria.
- Verification: Phone or Email.






Users

Docket Uptake







Consumer Access in CO


- Colorado has 2 consumer access solutions
 - Vendor solution: CIIS Public Portal
 - OIT solution: myColoradoApp
- Rolled out in May 2021
- Validation: Matching criteria
- Verification: Mobile Phone or Email
 - Vendor solution: match sends authentication code


Successful Requests

Percent of successful child requests: 2.27%


Percent of successful adult requests: 42.16%

Staffing Needs

Minnesota

- MIIC Public Inquiry Program (MN)
- For MIIC-related inquiries from the public
- Staffed by
 - Content Leads (3 staff at 0.20 FTE each)
 - Student Workers (3-5 staff at 0.75 FTE each)
 - Contractors (3 staff at 0.75 FTE each)

Colorado

- CIIS Help Desk (CO)
- Provide support to users of CIIS and assist the public with accessing immunization records
- Staffed by
 - Full-Time, Permanent Staff (1)
 - Term-Limited thru 6/2024 (2)
 - Contractors (2)

Handling High-Volume/Surges

Technical

- MN: Docket queuing system
- CO: Vendor updated Twilio account; vendor required states to set up own Twilio account


Staffing

- MN: Staffing Plan with phases
- CO: No Staffing Plan. Very reactive as a result of Sweepstakes


Surges
