These documents build on and further clarify specifications in the HL7 v2.5.1 Implementation Guide (IG) for Immunization Messaging, Release 1.5 and Addendum, October 2018 (National IG).

- September recommendations have been approved and are posted on CDC's website
- New recommendations from professional organizations
- Vaccine Integrity Project
 - Reviewed evidence from the past year related to respiratory illness vaccines



National Updates

- Government shutdown continues
- Impacts on our work are minimal, at this time
- Administration – Reductions In Force
 - 1,300 originally at CDC on 10/10
 - All of CDC Washington plus hundreds of staff from NCIRD, MMWR, EIS, OPHDST
 - 700 CDC officials, including those at NCIRD have received notices of “rehiring”

Communicating the Benefits of Influenza Vaccination

Infographic Summary:

- Infuenza Flu:** Severity varies from year to year, but flu season always brings serious illness and deaths. During the 2023-24 season, the highest rates of hospitalizations and deaths were the highest since 2009, when the current surveillance system started, and 273 deaths in children were reported.
 - Flu is the best protection for you and your family.
 - Flu vaccination reduces the risk of more serious illnesses, hospitalizations, and deaths.
 - Flu vaccination rates have fallen in recent years, leaving more people at risk of severe flu.¹
 - Make sure you and your family are protected with the flu vaccine and other vaccines your patients may need, such as COVID-19, RSV, and pneumococcal vaccines. Flu vaccine may be given at the same time as other vaccines.
- Flu vaccination is very safe and the best way to prevent it and its complications.** Every year, millions of Americans get the flu vaccine. Vaccination is the best way to prevent the flu and its complications. Flu vaccination reduces the risk of more serious illnesses, hospitalizations, and deaths.
- Quick Tips:**
 - Communicate the benefits of influenza vaccination.
 - Encourage flu and other needed vaccinations at every clinical encounter.
 - Encourage patients to get vaccinated at the same time as other vaccines.
- What are the Benefits of Flu Vaccination?**
 - Reduces risk of the flu: ✓ In 2023-24, flu vaccination prevented an estimated 21-37 million illnesses, 47-62 million medical visits, and 118,000 hospitalizations.
 - Reduces hospitalizations and deaths: ✓ Flu vaccine has been shown to reduce the risk of having to go to the doctor with flu by 40% to 60%.
 - Reduces hospitalizations and deaths: ✓ Pediatric deaths from flu were cut in half for children with children with underlying high-risk medical conditions and by two-thirds for all children.
 - Reduces hospitalizations and deaths: ✓ Flu hospitalizations were cut in half for all adults (including those aged 65+).
 - Reduces hospitalizations and deaths: ✓ Flu hospitalizations dropped off dramatically among children with underlying medical conditions—by 79% for vaccinated people with diabetes and 52% for those with chronic lung disease.
 - Reduces hospitalizations and deaths: ✓ Flu-related illnesses hospitalizations in all ages were cut in half for who vaccinated.

- Advice about preventing diseases spread by insects or animals
- Information about disease outbreaks happening in the country

CDC Travel Health Notices  See a list of all active travel health notices for all destinations, including warnings that could alter your travel plans.

CDC Find a Clinic  Search for public health and private clinics that administer travel vaccines. This list may not include all locations that provide travel vaccines.

CDC Yellow Fever Vaccination Clinics  Facilities that administer yellow fever vaccine are authorized to issue an International Certificate of Vaccination (the "yellow card") to meet international requirements for proof of yellow fever vaccination. These facilities typically offer most, or all, vaccines travelers may need.


Fall Respiratory Virus Season

 - AAP and Common Health Coalition will review COVID vaccine liability considerations, shared clinical decision making, and informed consent.

Chapter Grantee Projects

- Four AAP chapters (Illinois, Iowa, Minnesota, and Montana/South Dakota) were awarded Immunization Partnership Grants from March – September 2025.
- Projects included social media communications campaigns, development of provider training materials, supporting and expanding VFC provider locations, and holding family-facing educational events.
- **Snapshot of Results**
 - Number of partner organizations engaged through the Partnership Grants: 26
 - Events: 11 events, 946 attendees (community members, pediatric practices, partners)
 - Promotional and Educational Materials: 15+ materials developed, 5670+ individuals reached
 - Social media: 14 social media assets created, 136+ posts on Facebook and Instagram
 - Number of individuals vaccinated: 218 (adults and children)
- All chapters reported that the funding increased partner/physician engagement with their activities and strengthened their capacity to build vaccine confidence in their communities.


